The Police Cadets (Scotland) Amendment Regulations 1976

In exercise of the powers conferred on me by section 27 of the Police (Scotland) Act 1967(a), and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, and after consulting the Police Council for the United Kingdom in accordance with section 4(4) of the Police Act 1969(b), I hereby make the following regulations:—

Citation

1. These regulations may be cited as the Police Cadets (Scotland) Amendment Regulations 1976.

Interpretation

2. In these regulations any reference to the principal regulations is a reference to the Police Cadets (Scotland) Regulations 1968(c), as amended(d).

3. The Interpretation Act 1889(e) shall apply for the interpretation of these regulations as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

Operation and effect

4. These regulations shall come into operation on 19th May 1976 and shall have effect as from 1st January 1976.

Amendments

5. For Regulation 15 of the principal regulations (travel allowances) there shall be substituted the following regulation:—

“Travel allowances

15.—(1) A police cadet shall, subject to paragraph (2), be entitled in any year to travel allowances in respect of the cost of up to three return journeys, actually made, to visit a parent or guardian where the cost of the return journey exceeds £0.500.

(2) An allowance payable under this regulation shall not in any case exceed the lesser of the two following amounts namely:—

- (a) the reasonable cost of the return journey actually made;
- (b) the reasonable cost of a return journey to the parent's or guardian's usual place of abode;

and, without prejudice to the said limitation, an allowance payable in respect of a return journey to a place outside the British Isles shall not exceed £36. In computing the amount referred to in sub-paragraphs (a) and (b) of this paragraph, any question as to reasonable cost shall be determined by the police authority.”.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Regulations.)

These Regulations amend the Police Cadets (Scotland) Regulations 1968.

Regulation 5 revises the maximum travel allowance for cadets travelling to their parents or guardian outside the British Isles from £15 to £36 and increases the minimum cost below which no reimbursement is made from 40 to 50 pence.

The provision that Regulation 5 shall have retrospective effect is contained in Regulation 4 (made in exercise of the power conferred by section 27(2) of the Police (Scotland) Act 1967).
