TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF EMPLOYMENT

The Employment Protection (Medical Suspension) Order 1976

<i>Coming into Operation</i>	<i>1st June 1976</i>

The Secretary of State in exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 29(3) of the Employment Protection Act 1975(a) ("the 1975 Act") and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf hereby makes the following Order:—

Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the Employment Protection (Medical Suspension) Order 1976 and shall come into operation on 1st June 1976.

Interpretation

2. The Interpretation Act 1889(b) shall apply to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

Additional provision

3. The Radioactive Substances (Road Transport Workers) (Great Britain) (Amendment) Regulations 1975(c) are hereby added to the list of specified provisions in Schedule 2 to the 1975 Act (provisions leading to suspension on medical grounds).

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order.)

This Order, which comes into operation on 1st June 1976, adds the Radioactive Substances (Road Transport Workers) (Great Britain) (Amendment) Regulations 1975 to the list of specified provisions in Schedule 2 to the Employment Protection Act 1975. The provisions in Schedule 2 are specified for the purposes of the right to remuneration on suspension on medical grounds under section 29 of the Act.
