MEDICINES

The Medicines (Pharmacies) (Applications for Registration and Fees) Amendment Regulations 1976

The Secretaries of State respectively concerned with health in England, in Wales and in Scotland and the Department of Health and Social Services for Northern Ireland, acting jointly, in exercise of powers conferred by sections 75(1) and 76(1), (2) and (6) of the Medicines Act 1968(a) and now vested in them(b) and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, after consulting such organisations as appear to them to be representative of interests likely to be substantially affected by the following regulations, hereby make the following regulations:—

Citation, commencement and interpretation

1. These regulations, which may be cited as the Medicines (Pharmacies) (Applications for Registration and Fees) Amendment Regulations 1976, shall be read as one with the Medicines (Pharmacies) (Applications for Registration and Fees) Regulations 1973(c) (hereinafter referred to as “the principal regulations”) and shall come into operation on 1st June 1976.

Amendment of regulation 3 of the principal regulations

2.—(1) In regulations 3(1) and (2) of the principal regulations, for “£8” there shall be substituted “£16”.

(2) In regulation 3(3) of the principal regulations, for “£5” there shall be substituted “£10”.

Exception for Northern Ireland

3. None of the amendments made in regulation 2 above shall apply to premises situated in Northern Ireland.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Regulations.)

These Regulations amend the Medicines (Pharmacies) (Applications for Registration and Fees) Regulations 1973 (the principal regulations) by prescribing higher fees for registration of premises at which a retail pharmacy business is or is to be carried on, the subsequent annual fees (retention fees) (regulation 2(1)) and increase the amount of the penalty for failure to pay the retention fee (regulation 2(2)), except in the case of Northern Ireland, where the fees remain unaltered, as does the penalty for failure to pay the retention fee.

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
