**The Anti-Dumping Duty (Temporary Suspension) (No. 2)
Order 1976**

The Secretary of State, in exercise of powers conferred by sections 1, 10(3) and 15(4) of the Customs Duties (Dumping and Subsidies) Act 1969^(a) and now vested in him^(b), and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Anti-Dumping Duty (Temporary Suspension) (No. 2) Order 1976 and shall come into operation on 24th May 1976.

2. The Interpretation Act 1889^(c) shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

3. The anti-dumping duty imposed by the Anti-Dumping and Countervailing Duties Order 1973^(d) on zirconium dioxide originating in the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics, which was temporarily suspended by the Anti-Dumping Duty (Temporary Suspension) (No. 3) Order 1975^(e) for a period of twelve months beginning with 24th May 1975, shall not be chargeable on zirconium dioxide imported into the United Kingdom during a period beginning on 24th May 1976 and ending on 30th June 1977.

This Order suspends for a further period up to and including 30th June 1977 the anti-dumping duty imposed by the Anti-Dumping and Countervailing Duties Order 1973 on zirconium dioxide originating in the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics.
