The Paraffin (Maximum Retail Prices) (Revocation) (No. 2) Order 1979

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 30th day of October 1979 Present,

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Whereas in exercise of his powers in that behalf the Secretary of State on the 10th July 1979 made the Paraffin (Maximum Retail Prices) (Revocation) Order 1979(a) which was laid before Parliament on the 11th July 1979:

And whereas pursuant to a resolution of the Commons House of Parliament passed on the 24th October 1979 an Address has been presented to Her Majesty, praying that the said Order be annulled:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in pursuance of section 5(1) of the Statutory Instruments Act 1946(b) and of all other powers enabling Her in that behalf, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

- 1. The Paraffin (Maximum Retail Prices) (Revocation) Order 1979 is hereby revoked.
- 2. This Order may be cited as the Paraffin (Maximum Retail Prices) (Revocation) (No. 2) Order 1979 and shall come into operation on 31st October 1979.

## **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

(This Note is not part of the Order.)

This Order, which is made under section 5(1) of the Statutory Instruments Act 1946, effects the revocation of the Paraffin (Maximum Retail Prices) (Revocation) Order 1979 following the presentation of an Address to Her Majesty by the Commons House of Parliament praying that that Order be annulled. The revoked Order revoked the Paraffin (Maximum Retail Prices) Order 1976 (S.I. 1976/1204) which imposed maximum retail prices in respect of the supply of paraffin intended for use in portable domestic oil burners, and the Orders amending that Order.
