The Prevention of Oil Pollution (Convention Countries) (Additional Countries) Order 1979

Made - - - - 26th June 1979
Laid before Parliament 4th July 1979

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 26th day of June 1979

Present.

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Whereas by section 21(3) of the Prevention of Oil Pollution Act 1971(a) it is enacted that Her Majesty, if satisfied that the government of any country has accepted any convention accepted by Her Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom in so far as it relates to the prevention of pollution of the sea by oil, may by Order in Council make a declaration to that effect:

And whereas Her Majesty is satisfied that the governments of the countries specified in the Schedule to this Order have accepted the International Convention for the Prevention of Pollution of the Sea by Oil 1954(b), a convention which has been accepted by Her Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom and which relates solely to the prevention of pollution of the sea by oil:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in pursuance of the powers conferred on Her by the said section 21(3) and of all other powers enabling Her in that behalf, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Prevention of Oil Pollution (Convention Countries) (Additional Countries) Order 1979 and shall come into operation on 25th July 1979.
- 2. It is hereby declared that the governments of the countries specified in the Schedule to this Order have accepted the International Convention for the Prevention of Pollution of the Sea by Oil 1954.
