CUSTOMS AND EXCISE

The Appointment of Ports (Preston, Fleetwood, Heysham and Workington) Order 1980

Made - - - 8th December 1980

Coming into Operation 31st December 1980

The Commissioners of Customs and Excise, in pursuance of the powers conferred on them by section 19 of the Customs and Excise Management Act 1979(a) and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the Appointment of Ports (Preston, Fleetwood, Heysham and Workington) Order 1980 and shall come into operation on 31st December 1980.

Interpretation

2. In this Order, "approaches" in relation to a dock or harbour means all waters leading thereto from the areas specified in the appointments contained in this Order.

Revocation of earlier appointments

3. The Return to the Court of Exchequer and Treasury Warrants set out in the Schedule hereto are hereby revoked.

Port of Preston

- 4.—(1) The Commissioners appoint as a port for the purposes of customs and excise those internal and territorial waters of Her Majesty's dominions within the area bounded:—
 - (a) to the south by a line on a true bearing 270° from a point north of Southport at latitude 53°41′51″ north, longitude 02°57′18″ west (a limit of the Port of Liverpool);
 - (b) to the north by a line on a true bearing 270° from a point north of Blackpool at latitude 53° 50′ 00″ north, longitude 03° 03′ 19″ west (a limit of the Port of Fleetwood);
 - (c) by mean high water line along the coast between the points described in (a) and (b) above; and
 - (d) by the seaward limit of territorial waters between the limits described in (a) and (b) above,

together with-

- (i) docks and harbours, including the approaches thereto, and
- (ii) as far as the tide flows, all rivers, canals, bays, creeks, streams, channels, waters and watercourses

giving on to the area specified in this Article.

(2) The Commissioners name the said port the Port of Preston.

Port of Fleetwood

- 5.—(1) The Commissioners appoint as a port for the purposes of customs and excise those internal and territorial waters of Her Majesty's dominions within the area bounded:—
 - (a) to the south by a line on a true bearing 270° from a point north of Blackpool at latitude 53° 50′ 00″ north, longitude 03° 03′ 19″ west (a limit of the Port of Preston);
 - (b) to the north by a line on a true bearing 270° from Plover Scar at latitude 53° 58′ 44″ north, longitude 02° 52′ 40″ west (a limit of the Port of Heysham);
 - (c) by mean high water line along the coast between the points described in (a) and (b) above; and
 - (d) by the seaward limit of territorial waters between the limits described in (a) and (b) above,

together with-

- (i) docks and harbours, including the approaches thereto, and
- (ii) as far as the tide flows, all rivers, canals, bays, creeks, streams, channels, waters and watercourses

giving on to the area specified in this Article.

(2) The Commissioners name the said port the Port of Fleetwood.

Port of Heysham

- **6.**—(1) The Commissioners appoint as a port for the purposes of customs and excise those internal and territorial waters of Her Majesty's dominions within the area bounded:—
 - (a) to the south by a line on a true bearing 270° from Plover Scar at latitude 53° 58′ 44″ north, longitude 02° 52′ 40″ west (a limit of the Port of Fleetwood);
 - (b) to the north by a line on a true bearing 270° from a point on the coast at latitude 54° 20′ 00″ north, longitude 03° 25′ 26″ west (a limit of the Port of Workington);
 - (c) by mean high water line along the coast between the points described in (a) and (b) above; and
 - (d) by the seaward limit of territorial waters between the limits described in (a) and (b) above,

together with-

- (i) docks and harbours, including the approaches thereto, and
- (ii) as far as the tide flows, all rivers, canals, bays, creeks, streams, channels, waters and watercourses

giving on to the area specified in this Article.

(2) The Commissioners name the said port the Port of Heysham.

Port of Workington

- 7.—(1) The Commissioners appoint as a port for the purposes of customs and excise those internal and territorial waters of Her Majesty's dominions within the area bounded:—
 - (a) to the south by a line on a true bearing 270° from a point on the coast at latitude 54° 20′ 00″ north, longitude 03° 25′ 26″ west (a limit of the Port of Heysham);
 - (b) to the north west by a line from a point on the east bank of the River Sark at latitude 54° 59′ 12″ north, longitude 03° 03′ 20″ west to a point at latitude 54° 57′ 30″ north, longitude 03° 07′ 00″ west, thence westwards to a point at latitude 54° 57′ 30″ north, longitude 03° 18′ 00″ west, thence on a true bearing 230° (a limit of the Port of Dumfries and Galloway);
 - (c) by mean high water line along the coast between the point described in (a) above and the point on the east bank of the River Sark described in (b) above;
 - (d) by the seaward limit of United Kingdom territorial waters between the limits described in (a) and (b) above,

together with-

- (i) docks and harbours, including the approaches thereto, and
- (ii) as far as the tide flows, all rivers, canals, bays, creeks, streams, channels, waters and watercourses

giving on to the area specified in this Article.

(2) The Commissioners name the said port the Port of Workington.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order.)

This Order, made under section 19 of the Customs and Excise Management Act 1979, defines the limits of four ports on the north-west coast of England for the purposes of customs and excise. The Order establishes a new customs and excise port of Heysham incorporating the former ports of Lancaster and Barrow in Furness. In addition the revised port of Workington incorporates the former ports of Workington, Whitehaven, Maryport and Carlisle.
