CUSTOMS AND EXCISE

The Customs Duties (ECSC) (No. 2) Order 1980*Made* - - - - - 18th December 1980*Laid before the House of Commons* 19th December 1980*Coming into Operation* - - - 1st January 1981

The Treasury, by virtue of the powers conferred on them by section 5(1) and (3) of the European Communities Act 1972(a) and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, on the recommendation of the Secretary of State, hereby make the following Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Customs Duties (ECSC) (No. 2) Order 1980 and shall come into operation on 1st January 1981.

2. The Customs Duties (ECSC) (No. 2) Order 1977(b) shall be further amended as follows:—

(a) for Article 6(2)(b) there shall be substituted the following:—

“(b) named in Part II if they are regarded as originating in that country by virtue of the application of the provisions relating to origin of goods in Council Regulation (EEC) of 25th November 1980 concerning the conclusion of the Second ACP-EEC Convention signed at Lomé on 31st October 1979(c) or Council Decision of 16th December 1980 on the association of the overseas countries and territories with the European Economic Community (EEC)(d).”;

(b) Article 6A shall be deleted;

(c) for Part II of Schedule 1 there shall be substituted the Schedule to this Order.

3. The Customs Duties (ECSC) Order 1980(e) is hereby revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order.)

This Order, which comes into operation on 1st January 1981, amends the Customs Duties (ECSC) (No. 2) Order 1977 (the 1977 Order) to reflect the coming into force on that date of the Second ACP-EEC Convention of Lomé, signed at Lomé on 31st October 1979. Part II of Schedule 1 to the 1977 Order, which lists the African, Caribbean and Pacific States and the Overseas Countries and Territories from which ECSC goods originating therein are exempted from customs duties under Article 6 of the 1977 Order, is replaced. The rules to be applied for determining whether goods originate in those States, Countries and Territories will in future be those contained in Council Regulation (EEC) No. 3225/80 and Council Decision No. 80/1186/EEC.

The Order also revokes the Customs Duties (ECSC) Order 1980 and deletes from the 1977 Order the provision added by that Order to provide for similar exemption from customs duties for ECSC goods originating in Southern Rhodesia (now Zimbabwe). Exemption for such goods is now provided under Article 6 of the 1977 Order as amended by this Order.
