EDUCATION, SCOTLAND

**The Education Authority Bursaries (Scotland)
Amendment Regulations 1980**

<i>Made - - - -</i>	10th July 1980
<i>Laid before Parliament</i>	23rd July 1980
<i>Coming into Operation</i>	13th August 1980

In exercise of the powers conferred upon me by sections 49(3) and 144(5) of the Education (Scotland) Act 1962(a) and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, I hereby make the following regulations:—

Citation and commencement

1. These regulations may be cited as the Education Authority Bursaries (Scotland) Amendment Regulations 1980 and shall come into operation on 13th August 1980.

Interpretation

2. In these regulations:—

the “principal regulations” means the Education Authority Bursaries (Scotland) Regulations 1978(b) and unless the context otherwise requires “bursary” and “payment period” shall have the meaning assigned to them in the principal regulations.

Amendment of principal regulations

3. The principal regulations shall be amended as follows:—

(a) in regulation 8(1)(c)(iii) and the proviso thereto (*assessment of full-time further education bursaries*) there shall be substituted—
for the sum of “£265” the sum of “£310”.

(b) in Schedule 1 (*assessment of higher school bursaries*):—

(i) in paragraph 1 for the Table there specified, there shall be substituted the following Table:—

(ii) in paragraph 4(2) and paragraph (ii) of the proviso thereto for the sum of “£315” there shall be substituted the sum of “£361”;

(c) in Part 1 of Schedule 2 (*assessment of estimated expenditure in relation to full-time further education bursaries*):—

(i) in paragraph 1(5) for the sums of “£9.75” and “£22.90” there shall be substituted respectively the sums of “£10.85” and “£26.25”;

(ii) in paragraph 1(6) for the sums of “£13.90” and “£22.90” there shall be substituted respectively the sums of “£15.95” and “£26.25”;

(iii) in paragraph 1(7) for the sum of “£16.35” there shall be substituted the sum of “£19.20”;

(iv) in paragraph 1(8) for the sum of “£7.45” there shall be substituted the sum of “£8.55”;

- (v) for paragraph 1(10) there shall be substituted the following paragraph:—

“(10) an allowance to be made by the education authority to any holder who has attained the age of 26 years before the start of the course of study for which the bursary is granted and who can satisfy the education authority that he or she was in full-time employment for a total of three years of the six years immediately preceding the start of the course. The allowance is:—

The prescribed allowance is applicable for the duration of the course of study for which the bursary is granted.”

- (d) in Part 2 of Schedule 2 (*assessment of contribution in relation to full-time further education bursaries*):—

- (i) in paragraph 4(3)(a) for the sum of “£315” there shall be substituted the sum of “£361”;

- (ii) for paragraphs 4(3)(b)(i), (ii) and (iii) there shall be substituted the following paragraph:—

“(b) in the case of a category B bursary £765 in respect of any person, other than a spouse, child or holder of a statutory award, dependent on the parent:

Provided that the said amount of an allowance specified in (a) or (b) of this sub-paragraph shall be reduced by the amount of the income during the said period of the dependant in respect of whom it is allowed;”

- (iii) in paragraph 6(a) for the sum of “£2,531”, in each place where it occurs, there shall be substituted the sum of “£2,931”;

- (iv) for paragraph 6(b) there shall be substituted the following paragraph:—

“(b) in the assessment of a category B bursary—

- (i) if the balance of the income of the parents or, as the case may be, the person legally liable to maintain the holder is not less than £5,800 and not more than £7,300, the contribution shall be £20 with the addition of £1 for every complete £7 by which the balance of income exceeds £5,800;

- (ii) if the balance of that income is more than £7,300 but not more than £11,600 the contribution shall be £234 with the addition of £1 for every complete £8 by which the balance of income exceeds £7,300;

- (iii) if the balance of that income is more than £11,600 the contribution shall be £771 with the addition of £1 for every complete £13 by which the balance of income exceeds £11,600

reduced in each case, in respect of each child of the parent (other than the student) who is wholly or mainly dependent on him, by £65 or, if the child holds a category B bursary or a grant for a degree or equivalent level course, by £175.”;

- (v) for paragraph 6(c) there shall be substituted the following paragraph:—

“(c) in the assessment of a category B bursary—

- (i) if the balance of the income of the spouse is not less than £4,500 and not more than £7,300 the contribution shall be £10 with the addition of £1 for every complete £5 by which the balance of income exceeds £4,500; and
- (ii) if the balance of that income is more than £7,300 the contribution shall be £570 with the addition of £1 for every complete £10 by which the balance of income exceeds £7,300

reduced in each case, in respect of each child of the parent (other than the student) who is wholly or mainly dependent on him, by £65.”

Transitional provision

4. Notwithstanding these regulations, the provisions of the principal regulations amended in regulation 3 above shall apply, as originally made, for the purposes of regulation 9 of the principal regulations in relation to any payment period expiring prior to or current at the date of coming into operation of these regulations.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Regulations.)

These Regulations amend the bursary rates and the parental and spouse contribution scales which are prescribed by the Education Authority Bursaries (Scotland) Regulations 1978, as amended by the Education Authority Bursaries (Scotland) Amendment Regulations 1979.
