The Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food and the Secretaries of State respectively concerned with the sea fishing industry in Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland acting jointly in exercise of the powers conferred on them by sections 5, 15(3) and 20(1) as read with section 22(2) of the Sea Fish (Conservation) Act 1967(a) and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, hereby make the following order:—

Citation and commencement

1. This order may be cited as the Herring (Specified North Sea Waters) (Prohibition of Fishing) Revocation Order 1981 and shall come into operation on 1st October 1981.

2. The Herring (Specified North Sea Waters) (Prohibition of Fishing) Order 1977(b) is hereby revoked.
