**The Milk Prices (Scotland) Amendment Order 1981***Made - - - - 22nd December 1981**Laid before Parliament 24th December 1981**Coming into Operation 1st January 1982*

In exercise of the powers conferred on me by sections 6 and 7 of the Emergency Laws (Re-enactments and Repeals) Act 1964(a), and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, I hereby make the following order:—

*Citation and commencement*

1. This order may be cited as the Milk Prices (Scotland) Amendment Order 1981 and shall come into operation on 1st January 1982.

*Amendment of the Milk Prices (Scotland) Order 1981*

2. The Milk Prices (Scotland) Order 1981(b) shall be amended as follows:—

- (a) in paragraph 1 of the Schedule 1 (maximum price of raw milk on sale for heat treatment and resale) for the words “16.860 pence per litre” there shall be substituted the words “17.983 pence per litre”;
- (b) in paragraph 1 of Schedule 2 (maximum wholesale price of pasteurised milk on sale from a dairy) for the words “116.000 pence per gallon/25.517 pence per litre” there shall be substituted the words “124.000 pence per gallon/27.277 pence per litre”.

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

*(This Note is not part of the Order.)*

This amending Order, which comes into operation on 1st January 1982, increases by 1.123 pence per litre the maximum price for the sale in Scotland (excluding certain islands) of raw milk for heat treatment. It also increases by 8 pence per gallon/1.760 pence per litre the maximum wholesale price of pasteurised milk on sale from a dairy in the same area.
