**The Lotteries (Variation of Monetary Limits)
(Scotland) Order 1981**

Made - - - - - *2nd April 1981*

Laid before Parliament *27th April 1981*

Coming into Operation *1st July 1981*

In exercise of the powers conferred on me by section 18(1)(a) and (b) of the Lotteries and Amusements Act 1976(a), and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, I hereby make the following order:—

1.—(1) This order may be cited as the Lotteries (Variation of Monetary Limits) (Scotland) Order 1981 and shall come into operation on 1st July 1981.

(2) This order shall extend to Scotland only.

2. In the provisions of the Lotteries and Amusements Act 1976 specified in the first column of the Schedule to this Order (which relate to the matters mentioned in the second column of that Schedule), for the monetary limits specified therein and set out in the third column of that Schedule, there shall be substituted the monetary limits specified opposite thereto in the fourth column of that Schedule.

This Order increases the monetary limits specified in the provisions of the Lotteries and Amusements Act 1976 which are mentioned in the Schedule to the Order. The limits relate to the rules governing lotteries promoted by local authorities or on behalf of societies registered under Part I of Schedule 1 to that Act.
