# PORT HEALTH AUTHORITIES, ENGLAND AND WALES

# The Hartlepool Port Health Authority Order 1982

Made - - - -

3rd September 1982

Coming into Operation

1st October 1982

The Secretary of State for Social Services, in exercise of powers conferred by sections 2, 3 and 9 of the Public Health Act 1936(a), and now vested in him(b), and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, having given the notices required by the aforesaid sections 2 and 9 of his proposal to make this order and not having received any notice of objection thereto, hereby makes the following order:—

#### Citation, commencement and interpretation

- 1.—(1) This order may be cited as the Hartlepool Port Health Authority Order 1982 and shall come into operation on 1st October 1982.
  - (2) In this order, unless the context otherwise requires—
    - "the Act" means the Public Health Act 1936;
    - "the Council" means Hartlepool Borough Council;
    - "the Port of Tees and Hartlepool" means the Port of that name as established for the purposes of the enactments relating to customs and excise.
- (3) References in this order to reference points shall be construed as references to National Grid reference points.

#### Port Health Authority

2.—(1) For the purposes of the Act, that part of the Port of Tees and Hartlepool together with the land described below to which this article applies shall be a port health district and the Council shall be the port health authority for that district.

- (2) This article applies to that part of the Port of Tees and Hartlepool within the area bounded:—
  - (a) to the north by a line on a true bearing 045° from the point where the boundary of the Borough of Hartlepool meets the coast at Crimdon Beck (reference point NZ4909 3683) to the seaward limit of the said Port:
  - (b) to the south by a line
    - (i) starting at the most northerly point of the North Gare Breakwater (reference point NZ5442 2843); thence
    - (ii) continuing to a point where the boundary of the Borough of Hartlepool meets the boundary of the Borough of Langbaurgh (reference point NZ5510 2843); and
    - (iii) thence on a true bearing of 045° to the seaward limit of the said Port.

together with such part of the district of the Borough of Hartlepool as is adjacent to or abuts on the waters of the part of the Port of Tees and Hartlepool aforementioned and comprises the whole of any wharf and of the area within the gates of any dock and the buildings thereon respectively.

#### Jurisdiction

- 3.—(1) Subject to paragraph (2) of this article the Council shall have jurisdiction as port health authority over all waters and land within the said port health district.
- (2) The Council shall not have jurisdiction as port health authority by virtue of paragraph (1) over any part of the Borough of Hartlepool which falls within the jurisdiction of any other port health authority.

## Functions assigned to Port Health Authority

- 4.—(1) There are hereby assigned to the Council as port health authority the functions, rights and liabilities of a local authority under the enactments specified in the Schedule to this order, so far as they are applicable to a port health authority and to any lands, waters, premises, vessels or persons within their jurisdiction.
- (2) For the purposes of the functions, rights and liabilities assigned to the Council by virtue of this order, the enactments mentioned in the Schedule to this order shall have effect as if—
  - (a) any vessel lying within their jurisdiction were a house, buildings or premises, and
  - (b) the master or other officer or person in charge of the vessel were the occupier.

(3) This article shall not apply to any vessel belonging to Her Majesty or to any vessel engaged in the service of Her Majesty, whether belonging to Her Majesty or not, or to any vessel belonging to the armed forces of any country to which the provisions of the Visiting Forces Act 1952(a) apply by virtue of section 1 of that Act.

#### Revocations

5. Article 23 of, and Schedule 1 to, the Hartlepool Order 1967(b) are hereby revoked.

### **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

(This Note is not part of the Order.)

This order constitutes part of the Port of Tees and Hartlepool as a port health district and the Council of the Borough of Hartlepool as port health authority for that district. Articles 3 and 4 relate to the jurisdiction and powers of the Council as port health authority. The order supersedes a similar order made under the Public Health Acts and confers upon the port health authority functions under general Acts relating to public health and food.
