**The Education (Mandatory Awards) (Amendment)
Regulations 1982***Made* - - - 9th September 1982*Laid before Parliament* 13th September 1982*Coming into Operation* 14th September 1982

The Secretary of State for Education and Science, in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 1 and 4(2) of the Education Act 1962(a), hereby makes the following Regulations:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Education (Mandatory Awards) (Amendment) Regulations 1982 and shall come into operation on 14th September 1982.

2. In sub-paragraph (a) of Schedule 1 to the Education (Mandatory Awards) Regulations 1982(b):—

- (a) the final word “and” shall be omitted from proviso (ii);
- (b) the word “and” shall be added at the end of proviso (iii); and
- (c) after proviso (iii) there shall be added the following proviso:—

“(iv) shall be £963 in the case of a course at an establishment of further education maintained by a Scottish education authority;”.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Regulations.)

These Regulations amend the Education (Mandatory Awards) Regulations 1982.

Subject to certain exceptions, the fees element of a mandatory award is, by reason of Schedule 1 to those Regulations, restricted to £480. The present Regulations make a further exception and provide that, in the case of a course at a further education establishment maintained by a Scottish education authority, the fee element shall be restricted not to £480 but to £963 (the fee level recommended to Scottish education authorities by the Convention of Scottish Local Authorities).
