

**1982 No. 1745****ANIMALS****DESTRUCTIVE ANIMALS****The Mink (Keeping) Order 1982**

*Approved by both Houses of Parliament*

The Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food, the Secretary of State for Scotland and the Secretary of State for Wales, being satisfied with respect to the non-indigenous animals which are the subject of this order that by reason of their destructive habits it is desirable to control the keeping of them and to destroy any which may be at large, acting jointly, in exercise of powers conferred by section 10(1) of the Destructive Imported Animals Act 1932<sup>(a)</sup> and now vested in them<sup>(b)</sup> and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, hereby make the following order:—

*Title, commencement and duration*

**1.** This order may be cited as the Mink (Keeping) Order 1982; it shall come into operation on 1st January 1983 and shall cease to have effect on 1st January 1988.

*Interpretation*

**2.** In this order—“mink” means the animal of the species *Mustela vison*.

*Keeping of Mink*

**3.** The keeping within Great Britain of any mink, except under a licence granted under the Destructive Imported Animals Act 1932, is prohibited.

#### EXPLANATORY NOTE

*(This Note is not part of the Order.)*

This Order, which comes into operation on 1st January 1983, continues the control over the keeping of mink within Great Britain by re-enacting a provision contained in the Mink (Keeping) Order 1977 (S.I. 1977/1994), which ceases to have effect after 31st December 1982, prohibiting the keeping of mink within Great Britain except under licence. In consequence of the making of this Order the provisions of the Destructive Imported Animals Act 1932 will continue to apply to mink. Those provisions include a requirement that occupiers of land who know that mink, not being kept under licence, are to be found there shall give notice of the fact to the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food in the case of land in England, or to the Secretary of State for Scotland in the case of land in Scotland or to the Secretary of State for Wales in the case of land in Wales.

As required by the proviso to section 10(1) of the Destructive Imported Animals Act 1932 this Order was approved by a resolution of the House of Lords on 30th November 1982 and by a resolution of the House of Commons on 29th November 1982.
