The Rate Support Grant (Scotland) Order 1982

In exercise of the powers conferred on me by the enactments set out in Schedule 1 to this order and since it appears to me that after the time when the amount mentioned in section 2(2)(a) of the Local Government (Scotland) Act 1966(a) was determined for the year 1981-82 the relevant expenditure of local authorities for that year has been substantially increased by reason of increases which have taken place in the level of prices, costs and remuneration, that no account was taken of these increases when the amounts of the rate support grants for the year 1981-82 were determined and that provision therefor can be incorporated in this order, and in exercise of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, after consultation with such associations of local authorities as appear to me to be concerned, and with the consent of the Treasury, I hereby make the following order:—

Title, commencement and interpretation

1.—(1) This order may be cited as the Rate Support Grant (Scotland) Order 1982 and shall come into operation on the day following the day on which it is approved by a resolution of the Commons House of Parliament.

(2) In this order—

“the Act of 1963” means the Local Government (Financial Provisions) (Scotland) Act 1963(b);

“the Act of 1966” means the Local Government (Scotland) Act 1966;

“the Act of 1973” means the Local Government (Scotland) Act 1973(c);

“the Act of 1975” means the Local Government (Scotland) Act 1975(d);

“the Order of 1980” means the Rate Support Grant (Scotland) Order 1980(e); and

“new town” means a new town in terms of the New Towns (Scotland) Act 1968(f).

Aggregate grants for 1982-83

2. The estimated aggregate amount of the rate support grants, the amounts of the needs element and the domestic element and the estimated amount of the resources element of the said grants for the year 1982-83 shall be the amounts set out in the following table:—

Domestic rate reduction for 1982-83

3. The amount of the reduction to be made under section 7(1) of the Act of 1966 shall be 3 pence in the pound being the amount which in my opinion corresponds to the amount of the domestic element for the year 1982-83.

Apportionment of needs element for 1982-83

4.—(1) Under paragraph 2(1) of Part I of Schedule 1 to the Act of 1966, part of the needs element for the year 1982-83 amounting to £17,000,000 (hereinafter referred to as the “extraordinary expenses portion”) shall be apportioned among those local authorities incurring extraordinary expenses in connection with developments relating to exploration for or exploitation of off-shore petroleum in the proportions which the net amount of such expenses of each authority (as determined by me in accordance with paragraph 2(2) of the said Part I) bears to the total of the net amount of such expenses incurred by all those authorities.

(2) Under paragraph 3 of Part I of Schedule 1 to the Act of 1966, part of the needs element for the year 1982-83 amounting to £3,900,000 (hereinafter referred to as the “prescribed amount”) shall be apportioned among regional and islands councils as set out in Schedule 2 to this order.

(3) The needs element for the year 1982-83 as reduced by the extraordinary expenses portion and the prescribed amount shall be known as the “general portion” and shall be apportioned as follows:—

- (i) among regions and islands areas, in proportion to their weighted populations determined in the manner provided in Schedule 3 to this order;
- (ii) the sum so apportioned to a region, between the regional council and all district councils within the region in the manner provided in Schedule 4 to this order;
- (iii) the sum so apportioned to all district councils within a region, among the district councils within the region in proportion to their weighted populations determined in the manner provided in Schedule 5 to this order; and
- (iv) the whole of the sum apportioned to an islands area shall be the islands council's allocation.

Weighted population and national standard amount per head for 1982-83

5. For the purposes of section 9(3) of the Act of 1963 and Part II of Schedule 1 to the Act of 1966 the weighted population of an area for the year 1982-83 shall be the total population of the area as estimated by the Registrar General of Births, Deaths and Marriages in Scotland in relation to 30th June 1981 and the national standard amount per head for the year 1982-83 shall be such as will result as nearly as may be in the distribution of the whole of the actual amount of the resources element for that year.

Aggregate grants for 1981-82

6. The estimated aggregate amount of the rate support grants and the amounts of the needs element and the domestic element fixed for the year 1981-82 by article 2 of the Order of 1980 as indicated in parentheses in the second column of the following table shall be redetermined and for those amounts there shall be substituted the amounts set out in the third column thereof; and the estimated amount of the resources element fixed for that year by the said article 2 as indicated in parentheses in the second column of the following table shall be redetermined and for that amount there shall be substituted the actual amount of the resources element set out in the third column thereof:—

SCHEDULE 3

DETERMINATION OF WEIGHTED POPULATION FOR APPORTIONMENT OF THE GENERAL PORTION OF THE NEEDS ELEMENT AMONG REGIONS AND ISLANDS AREAS

1. The weighted population of a region shall be the sum of the following calculated by me in relation to the region, that is to say:—

- (a) the total population multiplied by 16;
- (b) where the proportion which the population under 16 years of age bears to the total population is as specified in any line in column (1) of Table 1 annexed to this Schedule, the number derived from multiplying the number specified in the same line in column (2) of that Table by the number of the population under 16 years of age;
- (c) where the proportion which the population aged 65 years and over bears to the total population is as specified in any line in column (1) of Table 2 annexed to this Schedule, the number derived from multiplying the number specified in the same line in column (2) of that Table by the number of the population aged 65 years and over;
- (d) where the total population of any district within the region decreased during the period from 30th June 1975 to 30th June 1980, the number or, as the case may be, the aggregate of the numbers derived from multiplying by 15 the difference between the total population at 30th June 1980 and the total population at 30th June 1975 of each such district;
- (e) where the total population of any district within the region decreased during the period from 30th June 1970 to 30th June 1980 by more than 10 per cent of the total population at 30th June 1970, the number or, as the case may be, the aggregate of the numbers derived from multiplying by 9 the difference between the total population at 30th June 1980 and the total population at 30th June 1970 of each such district;
- (f) the number or, as the case may be, the aggregate of the numbers calculated in relation to each district within the region as follows:—
where the number obtained by dividing the area of the district expressed in hectares by the total population of the district is as specified in any line in column (1) of Table 3 annexed to this Schedule, the number derived from multiplying the number specified in the same line in column (2) of that Table by the total population of the district;
- (g) the number or, as the case may be, the aggregate of the numbers calculated in relation to each district within the region as follows:—
where the number obtained by dividing the total population of the district by the area of the district expressed in hectares is as specified in any line in column (1) of Table 4 annexed to this Schedule, the number derived from multiplying the number specified in the same line in column (2) of that Table by the total population of the district; and
- (h) the number or, as the case may be, the aggregate of the numbers calculated in relation to each district within the region as follows:—
where the total population of any district in which a new town is situated increased during the period from 30th June 1975 to 30th June 1980 by more than 5 per cent of the total population at 30th June 1975, the number derived by multiplying by 15 the difference between the total population at 30th June 1980 and the total population at 30th June 1975.

2. The weighted population of an islands area shall be the sum of the following calculated by me in relation to the islands area, that is to say:—

- (a) the total population multiplied by 16;
- (b) where the proportion which the population under 16 years of age bears to the total population is as specified in any line in column (1) of Table 1 annexed to this Schedule, the number derived from multiplying the number specified in the same line in column (2) of that Table by the number of the population under 16 years of age;

- (c) where the proportion which the population aged 65 years and over bears to the total population is as specified in any line in column (1) of Table 2 annexed to this Schedule, the number derived from multiplying the number specified in the same line in column (2) of that Table by the number of the population aged 65 years and over;
- (d) where the total population decreased during the period from 30th June 1975 to 30th June 1980, the number derived from multiplying by 15 the difference between the total population at 30th June 1980 and the total population at 30th June 1975;
- (e) where the total population decreased during the period from 30th June 1970 to 30th June 1980 by more than 10 per cent of the total population at 30th June 1970, the number derived from multiplying by 9 the difference between the total population at 30th June 1980 and the total population at 30th June 1970;
- (f) where the number obtained by dividing the area of the islands area expressed in hectares by the total population is as specified in any line in column (1) of Table 3 annexed to this Schedule, the number derived from multiplying the number specified in the same line in column (2) of that Table by the total population;
- (g) where the number obtained by dividing the total population by the area of the islands area expressed in hectares is as specified in any line in column (1) of Table 4 annexed to this Schedule, the number derived from multiplying the number specified in the same line in column (2) of that Table by the total population; and
- (h) the total population multiplied by 12 in the case of the Western Isles Islands Area and 10 in the case of Shetland Islands Area and Orkney Islands Area.
3. For the purposes of this Schedule:—
- (a) the total population of any region or islands area in relation to the numbers to be calculated according to paragraphs 1(a) and 2(a) above shall be as estimated by the Registrar General of Births, Deaths and Marriages in Scotland in relation to 30th June 1981;
- (b) the total population of any region, district or islands area and the numbers of persons under 16 years of age and aged 65 years and over in any such population in relation to the numbers to be calculated according to paragraph 1(b), (c), (d), (e), (f), (g) and (h) and paragraph 2(b), (c), (d), (e), (f), (g) and (h) above shall be as estimated by the Registrar General of Births, Deaths and Marriages in Scotland in relation to 30th June 1980;
- (c) the number of hectares comprised in the area of a district or an islands area shall be the number so comprised on 31st December 1981 and certified by the Ordnance Survey; and
- (d) in relation to the numbers to be calculated according to paragraph 1(f) and (g) above, no account shall be taken of any alterations to the boundaries of districts within a region where such alterations come into operation on or after the date of coming into operation of this order and the boundaries of the region remain unaltered.

SCHEDULE 4

DIVISION OF THE GENERAL PORTION OF THE NEEDS ELEMENT APPORTIONED TO EACH REGION BETWEEN THE REGIONAL COUNCIL AND THE DISTRICT COUNCILS WITHIN THE REGION

1. (a) Where the total population of the region is 225,000 or less the district councils' allocation of the amount apportioned to the region shall bear the same proportion to that amount as the total population of the region multiplied by 1.36 bears to the weighted population of the region calculated under Schedule 3 to this order, and the regional council's allocation shall be the difference between the district councils' allocation and the amount apportioned to the region.
- (b) Where the total population of the region exceeds 225,000 but does not exceed 1,000,000 the district councils' allocation of the amount apportioned to the region shall bear the same proportion to that amount as the total population of the region multiplied by 1.59 bears to the weighted population of the region calculated under

Schedule 3 to this order, and the regional council's allocation shall be the difference between the district councils' allocation and the amount apportioned to the region.

(c) Where the total population of the region exceeds 1,000,000 the district councils' allocation of the amount apportioned to the region shall bear the same proportion to that amount as the total population of the region multiplied by 2.25 bears to the weighted population of the region calculated under Schedule 3 to this order, and the regional council's allocation shall be the difference between the district councils' allocation and the amount apportioned to the region.

2. For the purposes of this Schedule the total population of the region shall be as estimated by the Registrar General of Births, Deaths and Marriages in Scotland in relation to 30th June 1981.

SCHEDULE 5

Article 4(3)

DETERMINATION OF WEIGHTED POPULATION FOR APPORTIONMENT OF THE GENERAL PORTION OF THE NEEDS ELEMENT ALLOCATED TO DISTRICT COUNCILS IN EACH REGION AMONG THE DISTRICT COUNCILS WITHIN THAT REGION

1. The weighted population of a district shall be the sum of the following calculated by me in relation to the district, that is to say:—

- (a) the total population multiplied by 1.25;
- (b) where the total population decreased during the period from 30th June 1970 to 30th June 1980 by more than 8 per cent of the total population at 30th June 1970, the difference between the total population at 30th June 1980 and the total population at 30th June 1970;
- (c) where the number obtained by dividing the area of the district expressed in hectares by the total population is as specified in any line in column (1) of Table 1 annexed to this Schedule, the number derived from multiplying the numbers specified in the same line in column (2) of that Table by the total population; and
- (d) where the number obtained by dividing the total population by the area of the district expressed in hectares is as specified in any line in column (1) of Table 2 annexed to this Schedule, the number derived from multiplying the numbers specified in the same line in column (2) of that Table by the total population.

2. For the purposes of this Schedule:—

- (a) the total population of any district for the purpose of paragraph 1(a) above shall be as estimated by the Registrar General of Births, Deaths and Marriages in Scotland in relation to 30th June 1981;
- (b) the total population of any district in relation to the number to be calculated according to paragraph 1(b), (c) and (d) above shall be as estimated by the Registrar General of Births, Deaths and Marriages in Scotland in relation to 30th June 1980; and
- (c) the number of hectares comprised in the area of a district shall be the number so comprised on 31st December 1981 and certified by the Ordnance Survey.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order.)

This Order:—

(a) In relation to the year 1982-83—

- (i) fixes the estimated aggregate amount of the rate support grants payable under Part I of the Local Government (Scotland) Act 1966 to regional, islands and district councils in Scotland, and the division of this amount among the needs element, the estimated resources element and the domestic element;
- (ii) prescribes the amount in the pound by which rating authorities are to reduce the rate in the pound which they would otherwise levy on dwelling-houses in their areas so as to take account of the amount of domestic element for the year; and
- (iii) prescribes matters relating to the distribution of the needs and resources elements of rate support grants among local authorities; and

(b) In relation to the year 1981-82—

increases the estimated aggregate amount of the rate support grants, the amounts of the needs and domestic elements and prescribes the actual amount of the resources element payable for that year.

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
