The Slaughter of Pigs (Anaesthesia) (Amendment) Regulations 1983

Made	5th May 1983

The Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food in relation to England and the Secretary of State in relation to Wales, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 38 of the Slaughterhouses Act 1974(a) and now vested in them (b), and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, after consultation with such organisations as appear to them to represent the interests concerned in accordance with subsection (1) of the said section 38, hereby make the following regulations-

Title and commencement

1. These regulations may be cited as the Slaughter of Pigs (Anaesthesia) (Amendment) Regulations 1983 and shall come into operation on 3rd June 1983.

Amendment

2. In regulation 14 of the Slaughter of Pigs (Anaesthesia) Regulations 1958 (c) for the words "fifty pounds" there shall be substituted the words "two hundred pounds".
