The Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 2(1) as read with section 11 of the Diseases of Fish Act 1937(a), and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, being satisfied as respects the area comprising such part of Sailean Rudha Bay, Loch Etive, Argyll lying to the south of a straight line drawn between those points on the headlands of the bay to which Ordnance Survey grid references NM983339 and NM985341 respectively refer up to the High Water Mark of Ordinary Spring Tides that the waters therein are no longer infected waters, hereby makes the following order:—

*Citation and commencement*

1. This order may be cited as the Diseases of Fish (Infected Area) (Scotland) Revocation (No. 6) Order 1984 and shall come into operation on 4th April 1984.

*Revocation of order*

2. The Diseases of Fish (Infected Area) (Scotland) No 4 Order 1975(b) is hereby revoked.
