The Value Added Tax (Lifeboats) Order 1984

Made	30th April 1984
Laid before the House of Commons	10th May 1984
Coming into Operation	1st June 1984

The Treasury, in exercise of the powers conferred on them by section 16(4) of the Value Added Tax Act 1983(a) and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, hereby make the following Order:

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Value Added Tax (Lifeboats) Order 1984 and shall come into operation on 1st June 1984.
- 2. Schedule 5 to the Value Added Tax Act 1983 shall be varied by amending Group 10 in accordance with the following provisions.
 - 3. For item 3, there shall be substituted the following:
 - "3. (a) The supply to and repair or maintenance for the Royal National Lifeboat Institution of—
 - (i) any lifeboat;
 - (ii) carriage equipment designed solely for the launching and recovery of lifeboats;
 - (iii) tractors for the sole use of the launching and recovery of lifeboats;
 - (iv) winches and hauling equipment for the sole use of the recovery of lifeboats;
 - (b) The modification, repair or maintenance for the Royal National Lifeboat Institution of slipways used for the launching and recovery of lifeboats.".

4. In note (2), for the word "craft" there shall be substituted the words "the goods".

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order.)

This Order extends the zero-rating relief on the supply of goods and services for the Royal National Lifeboat Institution in item 3 of Group 10 of Schedule 5 to the Value Added Tax Act 1983 to include:

- (a) the supply, repair or maintenance of carriage equipment and tractors for the launching and recovery of lifeboats;
- (b) the supply, repair or maintenance of winches and hauling equipment for the recovery of lifeboats;
- (c) the modification, repair or maintenance of slipways for the launching and recovery of lifeboats.
