**1985 No. 1191****CONSUMER PROTECTION****The Food Imitations (Safety) (Amendment) Regulations 1985***Laid before Parliament in draft*

<i>Coming into Operation</i>	<i>1st August 1985</i>

Whereas the Secretary of State has, in accordance with section 1(4) of the Consumer Safety Act 1978 **(a)**, consulted such organisations as appear to him to be substantially affected by these Regulations, such other persons as he considers appropriate and the Health and Safety Commission:

And whereas a draft of these Regulations has been approved by a resolution of each House of Parliament pursuant to section 7(7) of the said Act:

Now, therefore, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by section 1 of the said Act, hereby makes the following Regulations:—

**1.** These Regulations may be cited as the Food Imitations (Safety) (Amendment) Regulations 1985 and shall come into operation on 1st August 1985.

**2.** In the definition of “regulated product” in Regulation 2 of the Food Imitations (Safety) Regulations 1985 **(b)** the word “or” after “envelopes,” shall be deleted and the following words shall be inserted after the words “or paper”:—

“or anything consisting entirely of articles or substances used as ingredients in the preparation of food;”.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

*(This Note is not part of the Regulations.)*

These Regulations amend Regulation 2 of the Food Imitations (Safety) Regulations 1985 by excluding from the definition of “regulated product”, and thus from the scope of the Regulations, things made entirely of food ingredients.
