Burnham Committee) (Variation) Order 1985**

Coming into Operation 2nd December 1985

The Secretary of State for Education and Science, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 1(3) of the Remuneration of Teachers Act 1965(a), hereby makes the following Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Remuneration of Teachers (Primary and Secondary Education Burnham Committee) (Variation) Order 1985 and shall come into operation on 2nd December 1985.

2.—(1) The National Association of Teachers in Further and Higher Education shall cease to be represented on the Committee; and accordingly the Remuneration of Teachers (Primary and Secondary Schools Burnham Committee) Determination 1981(b) shall be varied by deleting the reference to that Association from the table in Part II of the Schedule to that Determination.

(2) In this article “the Committee” means the Committee constituted under section 1 of the Remuneration of Teachers Act 1965 for the consideration of the remuneration of teachers in primary and secondary schools maintained by local education authorities and of other persons employed by such authorities as teachers in the provision of primary and secondary education, not being teachers in an establishment maintained by a local authority in exercise of a social service function.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order.)

This Order ends with effect from 2nd December 1985, the representation of the National Association of Teachers in Further and Higher Education on the Burnham Committee concerned with the remuneration of teachers in primary and secondary schools maintained by local education authorities and of certain other teachers employed by such authorities, and varies the Remuneration of Teachers (Primary and Secondary Schools Burnham Committee) Determination 1981 accordingly.

Section 1(4) of the Remuneration of Teachers Act 1965 provides that, where an existing body will cease to be represented on the Committee, the Secretary of State's determination must be embodied in an order made by statutory instrument.

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
