ROAD TRAFFIC ROADS AND BRIDGES, SCOTLAND

The Restricted Roads (Classification or Type) (Scotland) Regulations 1985

Made ---5th December 1985Laid before Parliament10th December 1985Coming into Operation1st January 1986

In exercise of the powers conferred on me by sections 82(1) and 134(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, and having consulted such representative organisations as I think fit, I hereby make the following regulations:—

- 1. These regulations may be cited as the Restricted Roads (Classification or Type) (Scotland) Regulations 1985 and shall come into operation on 1st January 1986.
 - 2. These regulations shall extend to Scotland only.
- 3. The classification or types of road to which section 82(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 shall apply are roads classified by the Secretary of State under section 11 of the Roads (Scotland) Act 1984(b) as Class C and unclassified roads.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Regulations.)

Section 82(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 provides that a road shall be a restricted road, that is a road to which a 30 m.p.h. speed limit applies automatically, if (a) there is provided on it a system of carriageway lighting furnished by means of lamps placed not more than 185 metres apart and (b) the road is of a classification or type specified for the purposes of the subsection in regulations made by the Secretary of State. These regulations specify class C roads and unclassified roads as roads to which section 82(1) shall apply.
