## HEALTH AND SAFETY

**The Health and Safety (Fees for Medical Examinations)  
Regulations 1985**

<i>Made - - - -</i>	<i>28th February 1985</i>

The Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 43(2), (4), (5) and (6) of the Health and Safety at Work etc. Act 1974 (a) ("the 1974 Act") and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf and for the purpose of giving effect without modifications to proposals submitted to him by the Health and Safety Commission under section 11(2)(d) of the 1974 Act, hereby makes the following Regulations:—

*Citation, commencement and interpretation*

1.—(1) These Regulations may be cited as the Health and Safety (Fees for Medical Examinations) Regulations 1985 and shall come into operation on 1st April 1985.

(2) In these Regulations "employment medical adviser" means an employment medical adviser appointed under section 56(1) of the Health and Safety at Work etc. Act 1974.

*Fees for examination by an employment medical adviser*

2.—(1) Fees shall be payable to the Health and Safety Executive by an employer in respect of a medical examination of any of his employees by an employment medical adviser for the purposes of any provision specified in column 1 of Schedule 1 to these Regulations; and the fees shall be ascertained in accordance with paragraph (2) of this Regulation.

(2) The fees shall be a basic fee for each examination together with additional fees for X-rays and laboratory tests where these are taken or carried out in connection with the examination (whether in pursuance of a requirement in the relevant provision or otherwise); and for each provision specified in column 1 of Schedule 1 to these Regulations—

- (a) the basic fee shall be the amount specified in column 3 for that provision;
- (b) the additional fee for X-rays shall be the amount specified in column 4 for that provision and shall cover all X-rays taken in connection with any one examination;
- (c) the additional fee for laboratory tests shall be the amount specified in column 5 for that provision and shall cover all such tests carried out in connection with any one examination.

(3) Where an employment medical adviser carries out a medical examination of a self-employed person for the purposes of the Asbestos (Licensing) Regulations 1983 (a), that self-employed person shall pay to the Executive fees ascertained in accordance with paragraph (2) of this Regulation.

*Fees for medical surveillance by an employment medical adviser under the Control of Lead at Work Regulations 1980*

3. Fees shall be payable to the Health and Safety Executive by an employer in respect of medical surveillance of any of his employees by an employment medical adviser for the purposes of the Control of Lead at Work Regulations 1980 (b); and such fees shall be ascertained in accordance with Schedule 2 to these Regulations.

*Revocations*

4. The following Regulations are hereby revoked—
- (a) the Health and Safety (Fees for Medical Examinations) Regulations 1984 (c);
  - (b) Regulation 6(5) of the Asbestos (Licensing) Regulations 1983.

## SCHEDULE 2

## Regulation 3

The fees payable under Regulation 3 for medical surveillance for the purposes of the Control of Lead at Work Regulations 1980 shall be—

- (a) for the first assessment (including any clinical medical examination and laboratory tests in connection with the assessment) of an employee, £32.00;
- (b) in connection with any other assessment of an employee—
  - (i) for laboratory tests where these are carried out, £24.00;
  - (ii) for a clinical medical examination where this is carried out, £10.50.

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

*(This Note is not part of the Regulations.)*

These Regulations increase the fees payable to the Health and Safety Executive for work done by employment medical advisers, appointed under the Health and Safety at Work etc. Act 1974, in conducting various medical examinations by virtue of the Factories Act 1961 (c.34) and for the purposes of the Control of Lead at Work Regulations 1980 and the Asbestos (Licensing) Regulations 1983. Such fees are payable by employers in respect of their employees and also, in the case of the Asbestos (Licensing) Regulations, by self-employed persons in respect of themselves.

In relation to ionising radiation, the fees for a basic medical examination and covering all laboratory tests are increased by £1.50 and £0.50 to £33.00 and £15.00 respectively. For other Factories Act purposes such fees are increased by £1.00 so that the charge for a basic medical examination now ranges from £21.00 to £26.00 and the fee covering all laboratory tests is £13.50. The fee covering all X-rays taken for any of the above purposes is £22.50, an increase of £1.00.

For the Control of Lead at Work Regulations, the fee for a first assessment is now £32.00, an increase of £1.00; for any other assessment the fee covering all laboratory tests is raised by £1.00 to £24.00 and the fee for the clinical medical examination is raised by £0.50 to £10.50.

The foregoing fees were previously determined by the Health and Safety (Fees for Medical Examinations) Regulations 1984 which are revoked.

In respect of the Asbestos (Licensing) Regulations 1983, the charge for a basic medical examination remains £30.00, the fee covering all X-rays is increased by £3.00 to £22.50 and the fee covering all laboratory tests is increased by £2.00 to £13.50. Such fees were previously determined by Regulation 6(5) of those Regulations which is revoked.
