## EDUCATION, SCOTLAND

**The Education (Grants for In-service Training of Teachers)  
(Scotland) Regulations 1985**

In exercise of the powers conferred on me by sections 73(a) and 74(1) of the Education (Scotland) Act 1980 (a), and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, I hereby make the following regulations:—

*Citation and commencement*

1. These regulations may be cited as the Education (Grants for In-service Training of Teachers) (Scotland) Regulations 1985 and shall come into operation on 22nd April 1985.

*Interpretation*

2. In these regulations—

“teachers” includes lecturers employed by education authorities in colleges of further education.

*Grants by the Secretary of State*

3. The Secretary of State may, subject to the provisions of these regulations, pay to education authorities grants of such amount as he thinks necessary or expedient in respect of the expense of teachers in their employment undergoing in-service training.

*Training in respect of which grants may be paid*

4. A grant shall be paid only in respect of a teacher who is participating in a course within a subject area listed in the Schedule to these regulations.

*Application for and payment of grants*

5.—(1) Applications for grants shall be made in writing to the Secretary of State by education authorities and the Secretary of State shall in any year advise education authorities by circular of the procedure for making applications and the last day by which applications must be received by him.

(2) Payment of these grants shall be made to education authorities by two instalments paid half-yearly in arrears, but if any teacher in respect of whom a grant has been approved fails to complete the course the Secretary of State may revoke the grant and recover from the education authority the whole or such part as he considers appropriate of such grant.

## Regulation 4

Subject areas in respect of which grants may be paid

*Primary Education*

Primary science development project– the way ahead.  
Organisation for learning and teaching in primary school.  
Assessment in the primary school.

*Secondary Education*

Media education across the curriculum.  
Guidance 12–16: Trends and prospects.  
The microcomputer and the language specialist.  
Social subjects in the common course in year 1 and 2 of the secondary school.  
Electronics, microelectronics and microcomputing in standard grade technical studies.  
Module course writing in physical education.

*Secondary/Further Education*

Action plan for the 16–18s.  
16–18: The changing role of guidance.

*General*

Courses in management for promoted staff in schools.  
Courses in use of microcomputers.  
Courses in learning difficulties.  
Courses in retraining secondary teachers in surplus subject areas.  
Courses guidance, counselling and assessment for the 16–18 age group.

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

*(This Note is not part of the Regulations.)*

Under section 73 of the Education (Scotland) Act 1980 the Secretary of State may in accordance with regulations made by him make payment of such sums as he thinks necessary and expedient for various purposes. Section 74(1) of the Act enables the Secretary of State to prescribe in regulations conditions with which the recipients of the grant are required to comply. These regulations revoke and replace the Education (Grants for In-service Training of Teachers) (Scotland) Regulations 1984 as amended and continue to provide for the payment to education authorities of grants in respect of the expense of teachers undergoing in-service training in the subject areas listed in the Schedule to the regulations. They make the following changes of substance: “teachers” is defined to include lecturers employed by education authorities in colleges of further education and a new list of subject areas in respect of which grants may be paid is given in the Schedule. Applications for grants require to be made in writing and provision is made for revocation of grant and recovery of any payment already made should a teacher fail to complete a course.
