CONTAMINATION OF FOOD

**The Food Protection (Emergency Prohibitions) (No. 8)
(Amendment No. 6) Order 1986***Made* - - - - 6th November 1986*Laid before Parliament* 7th November 1986*Coming into Operation* 7th November 1986

Whereas the Secretary of State is of the opinion, in accordance with section 1(1)(a) of the Food and Environment Protection Act 1985(a), that there has been or may have been an escape of substances of such descriptions and in such quantities and such circumstances as are likely to create a hazard to human health through human consumption of food;

And whereas he is of the opinion, in accordance with section 1(1)(b) of the said Act, that in consequence of the said escape of substances, food which is, or may be in the future, in the areas described in Schedule 1 to the principal order, or which is, or may be in the future, derived from anything in those areas, is, or may be, or may become, unsuitable for human consumption;

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred on him by the said section 1(1) and section 24(3) of the said Act, and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, he hereby makes the following order:-

Title, commencement and interpretation

1.—(1) This order may be cited as the Food Protection (Emergency Prohibitions) (No. 8) (Amendment No. 6) Order 1986 and shall come into operation on 7th November 1986.

(2) In this order “the principal order” means the Food Protection (Emergency Prohibitions) (No. 8) Order 1986(a).

Amendment of the principal order

2. The principal order is amended as follows:-

(a) After paragraph (g) of article 7 of the principal order there shall be added the following paragraphs:-

“(h) on 26th September 1986, was in those parts of the designated areas described in paragraphs 1(i), (j) and (k) and 2(b)(v) of the said Schedule 2;

(i) on 11th October 1986 was in that part of the designated areas described in paragraph 1(l) of the said Schedule 2;

(j) on 30th October 1986 was in those parts of the designated areas described in paragraph 1(m), (n) and (o) of the said Schedule 2.”.

(b) Schedule 2 to the principal order shall be amended in accordance with the provisions set out in the Schedule to this order.

Revocation

3.—(1) The principal order is revoked in its application to that part of the designated area within the Strathclyde Region comprising part of the Parish of Dalmellington.

(2) The Food Protection (Emergency Prohibitions) (No. 8) (Amendment No. 3) Order 1986(b), the Food Protection (Emergency Prohibitions) (No. 8) (Amendment No. 4) Order 1986(c) and the Food Protection (Emergency Prohibitions) (No. 8) (Amendment No. 5) Order 1986(d) are hereby revoked.

Article 2(b)

SCHEDULE

1. In paragraph 1 of Schedule 2 to the principal order for sub-paragraphs (i) to (n) inclusive the following sub-paragraph shall be substituted:-

- “(i) the area of land within the boundaries of Nithsdale District comprising the Parish of Ruthwell but excluding therefrom the area described in sub-paragraph (l) below;
- (j) the area of land within the boundaries of Stewartry District comprising the Parish of Kirkgunzeon but excluding therefrom the area described in sub-paragraph (m) below;
- (k) the area of land within the boundaries of Stewartry District and Parish of Carsphairn but excluding -
 - (i) the area of land described as follows:- on or towards the north-west by the boundary between Strathclyde Region and Dumfries and Galloway Region at Loch Doon running in a north-easterly direction until the boundary meets the Brownhill Burn and then on the north-east by the Brownhill Burn running in a south-easterly direction until it meets the Water of Deugh and then on or towards the east by the Water of Deugh running in a southerly direction to the point national grid reference NX548983 and then in a south-westerly direction to the point national grid reference NX533970 and then following the Road A713 in a north-westerly direction to the north-east of the Plantation of Cullendoch Hill and then following the north-eastern boundary of said last mentioned Plantation until it meets the boundary between Strathclyde Region and Dumfries and Galloway Region at Loch Doon.
 - (ii) the area of land described in sub-paragraph (o) below;
- (l) the area of land within the boundaries of Nithsdale District comprising that part of the Parish of Ruthwell described as follows:-
On the west, from the point where Longbridgemuir Plantation and Cockpool Plantation meet running in a north-westerly direction by the eastern boundary of Longbridgemuir Plantation, until it meets the Black Grain Burn; on or towards the north in an easterly direction by the Black Grain Burn and the Kirkshiel Burn until it meets the western boundary of Stragglingswath Plantation; on or towards the east by the ditch leading to Longbridgemuir, the Longbridgemuir access road to Peter’s Plantation and along the line of the watercourse northwards to Dockridding Wood; on or towards the south-west and south, running in a north-westerly and westerly direction by the northern boundary of Dockridding Wood until it meets the Willow Burn, and on the east in a southerly direction by the Willow Burn, until it meets the eastern boundary of Cockpool Plantation and on the south by the northern boundary of Cockpool Plantation in a westerly direction until it meets the eastern boundary of Longbridgemuir Plantation.
- (m) the area of land within the boundaries of Stewartry District comprising the Parish of Kirkgunzeon and described as follows:-
On the north-west along the Road A711 in an easterly direction from Newfield to Beeswing, then on the north-east and south-east following the line of the boundary between Stewartry District and Nithsdale District to the point where it meets the boundary between the Parish of Kirkgunzeon and the Parish of Colvend at Cuil Hill and then following the line of that boundary until it meets the Kirkgunzeon Lane and then on the west by the Kirkgunzeon Lane until Newfield.
- (n) the area of land within the boundaries of Nithsdale District comprising the Parish of New Abbey but excluding therefrom the areas of land described as follows:-

- (i) On the west by Loch Arthur, on the north and east by Loch Arthur Plantations, on the south east by the fence from Loch Arthur Plantations running in a south-westerly direction until it meets the Glensone Hill Plantation and on the south by the Glensone Hill Plantation and the southern section of the Loch Arthur Plantations until it meets the eastern side of Loch Arthur.
- (ii) On the north by the Glensone Burn running in an easterly direction until it meets the weir below the junction of the Glensone Burn and the Kinharvie Burn, on the east by the Kinharvie Plantation and the Kinharvie Burn running in a southerly direction until Hawkhill, on the south by Hayfield Knowe part of the Kinharvie Plantation in a westerly direction until the Cullendeugh Plantation and on the west running in a north-westerly direction by the Cullendeugh Plantation and the Drungans Plantation until the said Plantation meets the Glensone Burn.
- (o) the area of land within the boundaries of Stewartry District and the Parish of Carsphairn described as follows:-
 - on the north-west from the Road A713 at the national grid point reference NX533970 in a north-easterly direction to the Water of Deugh at national grid point reference NX548983 and then running in a southerly direction until Knockingaroch and then on the south in a south-westerly direction by a dyke linking the Water of Deugh with Carsphairn Lane in a north-westerly direction until it meets the Lamloch Burn and then on the north-west running in a north-easterly direction by the plantation to the Road A713.”.

2. In Schedule 2, after sub-paragraph 2(b)(iv) there shall be added:-

“(b)(v) The area of land within the boundaries of Cumnock and Doon Valley District and Parish of Muirkirk described as follows:-

On the north from the point where the unclassified road running south from the Road A70 crosses the River Ayr and then in a westerly direction by the River Ayr until its junction with the Garpel Water then on the west by the Garpel Water running in a southerly direction until its source and then southwards to the boundary between the District of Cumnock and Doon Valley and the District of Clydesdale at the point where it connects with the boundary between the Parishes of Auchinleck and Muirkirk at Stony Hill and then on the south-east running in a northerly direction by the said boundary until Cairn Table Hill and then on the north-east in a north-westerly direction by a line from Cairn Table Hill to the source of the Auldhouse Burn and along the Auldhouse Burn until its junction with the River Ayr and then on the north in a westerly direction until the point where the unclassified road crosses the River Ayr.”.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order.)

This order corrects the amendments made to the principal order by the Food Protection (Emergency Prohibitions) (No. 8) (Amendment No. 3) Order 1986 ("No. 3 Order"), the Food Protection (Emergency Prohibitions) (No. 8) (Amendment No. 4) Order 1986 ("No. 4 Order") and the Food Prohibition (Emergency Prohibitions) (No. 8) (Amendment No. 5) Order 1986 ("No. 5 Order") which are revoked. The No. 4 Order inadvertently removed from Schedule 2 to the principal order certain areas of land added to that Schedule by the No. 3 Order. The No. 5 Order referred to one of these areas of land which had been removed.

This order sets out again the disapplication of articles 4, 5 and 6 of the principal order to sheep which on specified dates were in certain parts of the designated areas (article 7). The order also sets out again the descriptions of the said parts of the designated areas excepted from the said articles 4, 5 and 6 (Schedule 2).

The order also removes from the designated area in Strathclyde Region, that part of the Parish of Dalmellington which was a designated area.

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
