The Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 13 of the Diseases of Fish Act 1937^(a) and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, in relation to Scotland (including the marine waters thereof), hereby makes the following order:—

Title and commencement

1. This order may be cited as the Diseases of Fish (Definition of “Infected”) (Scotland) Order 1986 and shall come into operation on 17th March 1986.

Addition to definition of “infected” in Diseases of Fish Act 1937

2. In the definition of “infected” in section 10(1) of the Diseases of Fish Act 1937, there shall be added, in relation to Scotland (including the marine waters thereof), enteric redmouth disease (ERM).
