The Import Duty Reliefs (Revocation) Order 1987

The Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred on him by sections 1 and 4 of the Customs and Excise Duties (General Reliefs) Act 1979(1) and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order:

1. This Order may be cited as the Import Duty Reliefs (Revocation) Order 1987 and shall come into force on 10th November 1987.
2. The Import Duty Reliefs Order 1970(2) is hereby revoked.
3. This Order does not restrict any relief from customs duty otherwise than in pursuance of a Community obligation.
