**The Education (Grants for Further Training  
of Teachers and Educational Psychologists)  
(Scotland) Amendment Regulations 1987**

The Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred on him by sections 73(a) and (c) and 74(1) of the Education (Scotland) Act 1980<sup>(1)</sup>, and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following Regulations:

**Citation and commencement**

**1.** These Regulations may be cited as the Education (Grants for Further Training of Teachers and Educational Psychologists) (Scotland) Amendment Regulations 1987 and shall come into force on 1st December 1987.

**Amendment of principal Regulations**

**2.** For regulation 3(b) of the Education (Grants for Further Training of Teachers and Educational Psychologists) (Scotland) (No. 2) Regulations 1987<sup>(2)</sup> there shall be substituted the following:—

- “(b) educational psychologists in respect only of training consisting of either—
- (i) the preparation of, or engagement in, a project approved as suitable by the Secretary of State, on the advice of an assessor, or
  - (ii) attendance at a course leading to a post-graduate degree in educational psychology.”.
