**The County Council of West Midlands (M6 Motorway
Junction 10) (Connecting Road) Scheme 1985
Confirmation Instrument 1987**

Made - - - *18th February 1987*

The Secretary of State for Transport makes this Instrument in exercise of powers conferred by section 16 of the Highways Act 1980(a), and now vested in him (b), and of all other enabling powers:

1. The County Council of West Midlands (M6 Motorway Junction 10) (Connecting Road) Scheme 1985 is hereby confirmed with modification.

2. The said Scheme as confirmed (hereinafter referred to as "the Scheme") is set out in the Schedule hereto. Copies of the Scheme with its accompanying plan are deposited at the offices of the Department of Transport, Romney House, 43 Marsham Street, London SW1 3PY, and at the offices of the Metropolitan Borough Council of Wolverhampton, Civic Centre, Wolverhampton; Walsall Metropolitan Borough Council, Civic Centre, Walsall and at the Department of Transport, West Midlands Regional Office, Five Ways Tower, Frederick Road, Edgbaston, Birmingham B15 1SJ.

3. The Scheme will come into force on the date on which notice that it has been confirmed is first published in accordance with paragraph 1 of Schedule 2 to the Highways Act 1980.

4. This Instrument may be cited as the County Council of West Midlands (M6 Motorway Junction 10) (Connecting Road) Scheme 1985 Confirmation Instrument 1987.

THE SCHEDULE TO THE INSTRUMENT

THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF WEST MIDLANDS (M6 MOTORWAY JUNCTION 10) (CONNECTING ROAD) SCHEME 1985

The County Council of West Midlands make this Scheme in exercise of their powers under sections 16 and 17 of the Highways Act 1980 and of all other enabling powers:—

1. The Council are authorised to provide for the use of traffic of Classes I and II of the classes of traffic set out in Schedule 4 to the Highways Act 1980 a special road along the route described in the Schedule to this Scheme, for the purposes of connecting the Motorway with other highways at the places stated in that Schedule.

2. The centre line of the special road is indicated by a heavy black line on the deposited plan.

3. In this Scheme:—

“the Council”

means the County Council of West Midlands;

“the deposited plan”

means the plan numbered CE/D/6011/242 marked “The County Council of West Midlands (M6 Motorway Junction 10) (Connecting Road) Scheme 1985”, sealed with the Common Seal of the Council and deposited at the offices of the Council at County Hall, 1 Lancaster Circus Queensway, Birmingham B4 7DJ. A certified copy is also deposited at the Department of Transport;

“the special road”

means the special road which the Council is authorised by this Scheme to provide; and

“the Motorway”

means the M6 Motorway at and in the vicinity of Junction 10.

4. This Scheme may be cited as the County Council of West Midlands (M6 Motorway Junction 10) (Connecting Road) Scheme 1985.

THE ROUTE OF THE SPECIAL ROAD

The Home Purchase Assistance (Price-limits) Order 1987

Made - - - - - *24th February 1987*

*Laid before the
House of Commons* *6th March 1987*

Coming into force *27th March 1987*

The Secretary of State for the Environment, as respects England, and the Secretary of State for Wales, as respects Wales, in exercise of their powers under sections 445(2) and (3) of the Housing Act 1985(a), and the Secretary of State for Scotland, as respects Scotland, in exercise of his powers under sections 1(2) and 2(7) of the Home Purchase Assistance and Housing Corporation Guarantee Act 1978(b), and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, hereby make the following Order:

Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the Home Purchase Assistance (Price-limits) Order 1987 and shall come into force on 27th March 1987.

Prescribed price-limits

2. The amounts mentioned in the Schedule to this Order are hereby prescribed as the price-limits for the purposes of section 445 of the Housing Act 1985 or section 1 of the Home Purchase Assistance and Housing Corporation Guarantee Act 1978 (as the case may be) in respect of house property situated in the areas mentioned in relation thereto in that Schedule.

Revocation

3. The Home Purchase Assistance (Price-limits) Order 1986 (c) is hereby revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order)

Assistance for first-time purchasers of house property, under section 446 of the Housing Act 1985 as respects England and Wales and under section 1 of the Home Purchase Assistance and Housing Corporation Guarantee Act 1978 as respects Scotland, can take the form of a bonus of up to £110 on savings and a loan of £600 additional to that which the lending institution would otherwise have made and free of any obligation to repay principal or interest for up to five years. Assistance is only available where the purchase price of the property is within the limit prescribed by the Secretary of State by order. This Order prescribes limits for different areas which are higher than those prescribed by the Home Purchase Assistance (Price-limits) Order 1986, which is revoked.
