Her Majesty in exercise of the powers conferred upon Her by section 1(2) of, and paragraphs 1 and 4 of Schedule 1 to, the Medical Act 1983<sup>(1)</sup>, and of all other powers enabling Her in that behalf, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

**Citation and commencement**

1. This Order may be cited as the General Medical Council (Constitution) Amendment Order 1987 and shall come into force on 1st May 1987.

**Amendment of the General Medical Council (Constitution) Order 1979**

2. In paragraph (c) of article 2 of the General Medical Council (Constitution) Order 1979<sup>(2)</sup> (constitution of the General Medical Council) there shall be substituted for the number "11" the number "13".
