Her Majesty, in pursuance of section 5(4) of the Parliamentary Commissioner Act 1967<sup>(1)</sup>, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. This Order may be cited as the Parliamentary Commissioner Order 1987 and shall come into force on 6th May 1987.
2. Paragraph 8<sup>(2)</sup> of Schedule 3 to the Parliamentary Commissioner Act 1967 shall be amended in the following respects—
  - (a) the word “or”, in the second place where it occurs, shall be deleted; and
  - (b) after the words “the Rampton Hospital Board,” there shall be inserted the words “the Broadmoor Hospital Board or the Moss Side and Park Lane Hospitals Board,”.
