LEGAL AID AND ADVICE, SCOTLAND

**The Advice and Assistance (Scotland)
(Prospective Cost) Regulations 1988**

Made - - - - *29th July 1988*

Coming into force - - *1st August 1988*

The Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 36(2)(b) of the Legal Aid (Scotland) Act 1986⁽¹⁾, and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following Regulations, of which a draft has, in accordance with section 37(2) of that Act, been laid before Parliament, and approved by a resolution of each House of Parliament:

Citation and commencement

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Advice and Assistance (Scotland) (Prospective Cost) Regulations 1988 and shall come into force on 1st August 1988.

Amendment of financial limit

2. In section 10(2) of the Legal Aid (Scotland) Act 1986 there is substituted, in place of the sum of £50 therein mentioned, the sum of £60.
