DANGEROUS DRUGS

The Misuse of Drugs Act 1971 (Modification) Order 1989

Made - - - - 2nd August 1989

Coming into force - - 18th September 1989

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 2nd day of August 1989

Present,

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Whereas a draft of this Order has been laid before Parliament on the recommendation of the Advisory Council on the Misuse of Drugs and has been approved by a resolution of each House of Parliament: Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in pursuance of section 2(2) of the Misuse of Drugs Act 1971⁽¹⁾, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. This Order may be cited as the Misuse of Drugs Act 1971 (Modification) Order 1989 and shall come into force on 18th September 1989.

2. Schedule 2 to the Misuse of Drugs Act 1971 (which, as amended⁽²⁾, specifies the drugs which are subject to control under that Act) shall be amended by the insertion in paragraph 1 of Part III of that Schedule—

- (a) after the word “Bromazepam”, of the word “Buprenorphine”, and
- (b) after the word “Oxazolam”, of the word “Pemoline”.
