**The Misuse of Drugs (Amendment) Regulations 1989**

In pursuance of sections 7, 10 and 31 of the Misuse of Drugs Act 1971<sup>(1)</sup>, after consultation with the Advisory Council on the Misuse of Drugs, I hereby make the following Regulations:

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Misuse of Drugs (Amendment) Regulations 1989 and shall come into force on 18th September 1989.
2. The Misuse of Drugs Regulations 1985<sup>(2)</sup> shall be amended as follows:
  - (a) in paragraph 1(a) of Schedule 3, after “Benzphetamine” there shall be inserted “Buprenorphine”, and
  - (b) in paragraph 1 of Schedule 4, after “Oxazolam” there shall be inserted “Pemoline”.
