The Secretary of State for Transport, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14 of the Harbours Act 1964<sup>(1)</sup> and now vested in him<sup>(2)</sup> and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, and on the application of the Port of London Authority, hereby makes the following Order:-

**Citation and commencement**

1. This Order may be cited as the Port of London Authority Harbour Revision Order 1989 and shall come into force on 3rd May 1989.

**Amendment of Port of London Act 1968**

2. The limits within which the Port of London Authority have jurisdiction by virtue of the Port of London Act 1968<sup>(3)</sup> are hereby altered to exclude the area described in the Schedule to the Medway Ports Authority Harbour Revision Order 1989<sup>(4)</sup>; and accordingly paragraph 2 of Schedule 1 to that Act shall be amended by the insertion at the end of sub-paragraph (a) of the words “or the area described in the Schedule to the Medway Ports Authority Harbour Revision Order 1989”.
