The Secretary of State for Health, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 5(1) and (2) of, and paragraphs 1 and 2 of Schedule 3 to, the Public Expenditure and Receipts Act 1968(1) and now vested in him(2) and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following order:

Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the Registration of Births, Deaths and Marriages (Fees) (No. 2) Order 1992 and shall come into force on 1st April 1993.

Fees payable

2. The fees payable in England and Wales under each of the enactments specified in column 2 of the Schedule to this Order in respect of the matters specified in column 3 shall be the fees specified in relation thereto in column 4 and each of those enactments shall have effect accordingly.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order)

This Order specifies the fees payable for the year beginning 1st April 1993 under the Acts relating to the registration of births, deaths and marriages and associated matters.

The fees increased are those payable under section 5 of the Places of Worship Registration Act 1855, section 10 of the Savings Bank Act 1887 (as later amended), section 5 of the Young Persons (Employment) Act 1938, section 94(1) of the Education Act 1944, sections 27(6) and (7), 32(5), 41(6), 51(1) and (2), 57(4), 63(1)(b), 64(2)(a) of the Marriage Act 1949, section 35(1) of the Shops Acts 1950, sections 31(2)(a), 32(c), 33(1) of the Births and Deaths Registration Act 1953, sections 178(1) of the Factories Act 1961, section 1062(2) of, and Schedule 5 to, the Friendly Societies Act 1974 and section 160(2) of the Social Security Act 1975.

Otherwise the fees payable from 1st April 1993 are the same as those payable from 1st April 1992.
