the Firsarms (Amendment) Act 1997 requires you to notify the chief officer of police who issued your certificate This requirement applies even if the sale, loss, etc has happened outside Great Britain. It is an offence not to notify. Details of the notifications required are available from your local police.

- Under section 32 of the Firearms (Amendment) Act 1997 where a person sells, lets on hire, lends or gives a firearm or ammunition to which section 1 applies to another person who is not a registered firearms dealer or a person who is entitled to purchase or acquire the firearm or ammunition without holding a certificate
 - the person receiving the firearm or ammunition must produce the certificate or permit entitling him! her to purchase or acquire the firearm or ammunifion being transferred;

- the person selling, letting on hire, lending or giving the firearm or ammunition must comply with any instructions in the certificate or permit produced; and
- iii) the final hand over of firearms and ammunition must take place in person.

It is an offence for a person to fail to comply with these requirements.

Her Majesty's Customs and Excise will notify the chief officer of police who issued this certificate of any firearm which is imported into Great Britain on the authority of the certificats.

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
