- 1 A visitor's shotgun permit is required for the possession, purchase or acquisition of a shotgun and should be produced when shotgun ammunition is purchased.
 - 2 A shotgun is defined as:
 - i) a smooth bore gun (not being an airgun) which
 - ii) has a barrel length of not less than 60.96 cm (24 inches) and does not have any barrel with a bore exceeding 5.08 cm (two inches) in diameter;
 - iii) either has a magazine or has a non-detachable magazine incapable of holding more than two cartridges, and
 - iv) is not a cross-bow gun.
 Other smooth bore guns may require a visitor's firearms permit.
 - 3 Any shotgun imported into or exported from Great Britain must be declared to HM Customs and Excise together with this permit at the time and place of import or export as the case may be. No such declaration need be made by permit holders where the shotgun is directly imported from, or exported to, another Member State of the European Union, although a Customs Officer may ask to see the permit.
 - 4 The permit holder is requested to report the loss of this permit to the issuing police force at once.
 - 5 Under section 32 of the Firearms (Amendment) Act 1997 where a person sells, lets on hire, lends for more than 72 hours or gives a shotgun to another person who is not a registered firearms dealer or a person who is entitled to purchase or acquire the shotgun without holding a certificate -
 - i) the person receiving the shotgun must produce the certificate or permit entitling him/her to purchase or acquire the shotgun being transferred;
 - ii) the person selling, letting on hire, lending or giving the shotgun must comply with any instructions in the certificate or permit produced; and
 - iii) the final hand over of the shotgun must take place in person.
 - 6 If you
 - i) transfer a shotgun to anyone else including lending it for more than 72 hours, selling it, hiring it out or making a gift of it; or
 - ii) deactivate a shotgun on this permit or have it deactivated by someone else; or
 - iii) destroy a shotgun, lose a shotgun or have a shotgun stolen.
