**The Public Telecommunication System  
Designation (Thus Limited) Order 1999**

Whereas the Secretary of State has granted to Thus Limited on 7th October 1999 a licence (“the Licence”) under section 7 of the Telecommunications Act 1984<sup>(1)</sup> (“the Act”), to which section 8 of the Act applies, for the running of the telecommunication systems specified in the Licence (“the Applicable Systems”):

Now, therefore, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 9 of the Act, hereby makes the following Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Public Telecommunication System Designation (Thus Limited) Order 1999 and shall come into force on 5th January 2000.
2. Each of the Applicable Systems is hereby designated as a public telecommunication system.

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

*(This note is not part of the Order)*

The Secretary of State granted to Thus Limited a licence on 7th October 1999 under section 7 of the Telecommunications Act 1984 to run the telecommunication systems specified in the licence. A copy of the licence was laid before Parliament on 7th December 1999. This Order designates those telecommunication systems as public telecommunication systems. Consequently, by virtue of section 9(3) of that Act, Thus Limited will be a public telecommunications operator when the Order comes into force on 5th January 2000.
