## **EDUCATION, ENGLAND**

The Education (Leeds College of Music) (Transfer to the Higher Education Sector) Order 2005

Made - - - - 4th July 2005

Laid before Parliament 11th July 2005

Coming into force - - 1st August 2005

The Secretary of State to whom it appears that the full-time equivalent enrolment number of the institution conducted by Leeds College of Music(a) for courses of higher education exceeds 55 per cent of its total full-time equivalent enrolment number, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 122A of the Education Reform Act 1988(b), hereby makes the following Order:

- **1.** This Order may be cited as the Education (Leeds College of Music) (Transfer to the Higher Education Sector) Order 2005 and shall come into force on 1st August 2005.
- **2.** On the date on which this Order comes into force Leeds College of Music shall cease to be a further education corporation and shall become a higher education corporation.
