The Street Works (Inspection Fees) (England) (Amendment) Regulations 2009

The Secretary of State for Transport makes the following Regulations in exercise of the powers conferred by section 75 and 104(1) of the New Roads and Street Works Act 1991(a):

Citation and commencement

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Street Works (Inspection Fees) (England) (Amendment) Regulations 2009 and shall come into force on 6th April 2009.

Preliminary

2. The Street Works (Inspection Fees) (England) Regulations 2002(b) are amended as follows.

Amendment to regulations 3 (inspection fees)

3. In regulation 3, in paragraphs (1) and (8), for "£25.00" there shall be substituted "£50.00".

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order)

These Regulations amend the Street Works (Inspection Fees) (England) Regulations 2002 so as to increase the fee payable by undertakers for inspections of their work by street authorities in England under regulation 3 of those Regulations.

The fee for such inspections, which was last altered in April 2008, is increased by 100% from £25 to ± 50 .

The fee increase does not count as an impact as defined by the relevant guidance and no impact assessment is needed as it has been recommended to government by the industry involved.
