**The M5 Motorway (Junction 7, Worcestershire) (Slip Road)
(Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2009**

Made - - - - - *5 October 2009*
Coming into force - - - - - *12 October 2009*

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the M5 Motorway (“the M5”) and connecting roads, is satisfied that traffic on one of those connecting roads in the County of Worcestershire should be prohibited because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14 (1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as the M5 Motorway (Junction 7, Worcestershire) (Slip Road) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2009 and shall come into force on 12 October 2009.

2. In this Order –

“the slip road”	means the slip road leading from the northbound carriageway of the M5 at Junction 7;
"the works period"	means the period starting at 20.00 hours on Monday 19 October 2009 and ending when the said works have been completed;

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number.

3. Subject as mentioned in article 4, no person shall, during the works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in the slip road.

4. The provisions of article 3 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs and shall not apply to any vehicle -

- (a) being used for police, fire brigade or ambulance purposes;
- (b) proceeding at the direction of, or with the permission of, a police officer or traffic officer in

- (c) being used for or in connection with the said works or by a traffic officer.
