# PUBLIC PASSENGER TRANSPORT, ENGLAND AND WALES

The Public Service Vehicles (Registration of Local Services) (Amendment) (England and Wales) Regulations 2009

Made	2nd April 2009
Laid before Parliament	8th April 2009
Coming into force	3rd May 2009

The Secretary of State for Transport makes the following Regulations in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 52(1)(a) and 60(1)(e) and (1A) of the Public Passenger Vehicles Act 1981(1) and by sections 126(1) and 134 of the Transport Act 1985(2); and by virtue of The Department for Transport (Fees) Order 2009(3).

Representative organisations have been consulted in accordance with section 61(2) of the Public Passenger Vehicles Act 1981(4).

#### Citation, commencement and extent

**1.**—(1) These Regulations may be cited as the Public Service Vehicles (Registration of Local Services) (Amendment) (England and Wales) Regulations 2009 and shall come into force on 3rd May 2009.

- (b) in regulations 12(1)(b) and 12(2)(b), for "£57" substitute "£60".

### **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

(This note is not part of the Regulations)

These Regulations increase the fees for the registration of, or the variation of the registration of, a local bus service.

The fees for a community bus service are increased from £12 to £13. This represents an increase of 8.3%. The fees for community bus services were last increased on  $1^{st}$  April 2007.

The fees for a local bus service other than a community bus service are increased from  $\pounds 57$  to  $\pounds 60$ . This represents an increase of 5.3%. These fees were last increased on 1st August 2008.
