ROAD TRAFFIC

The M32 Motorway (Junctions 2-3) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2010

Made - - - - 5 May 2010

Coming into force - - 8 May 2010

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the M32 Motorway (“the M32”) and connecting roads, is satisfied that traffic on some of those connecting roads at Junctions 2 and 3 in the City of Bristol should be prohibited because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as the M32 Motorway (Junctions 2-3) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2010 and shall come into force on 8 May 2010 and apply for a period of twelve months.

2. In this Order –

“the slip roads” mean (i) the southbound entry slip road at M32 Junction 2 (including the dedicated slip lane southbound from Junction 2 to Junction 3; (ii) the northbound entry slip road at M32 Junction 2; (iii) the northbound exit slip road at M32 Junction 2; (iv) the southbound exit slip road at M32 Junction 2; (v) the southbound exit slip road at M32 Junction 3; and (vi) the northbound entry slip road at M32 Junction 3 (including the dedicated slip lane northbound from Junction 3 to Junction 2);

“the works” mean routine bridge and carriageway maintenance works including drainage, surfacing, gully cleaning, bridge inspections, parapet repairs, white lining, bridge painting, street lighting, debris clearing;

“a works period” means a period of 9 hours starting at 21.00 hours on Monday 10 May 2010 or any subsequent day and ending when the said works have been completed;

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number.

3. Subject as mentioned in article 4, no person shall, during a works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in the slip roads.

4. The provisions of article 3 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs and shall not apply to:

(a) 1984 c.27; a new section 14 was substituted by the Road Traffic (Temporary Restrictions) Act 1991 (c.26), section 1(1) and Schedule 1.

- (a) a vehicle being used for police, traffic officer, fire and rescue authority or ambulance purposes;
- (b) anything done at the direction of, or with the permission of, a constable or traffic officer in uniform;
- (c) a vehicle being used in connection with the said works.
