## **DANGEROUS DRUGS**

# The Misuse of Drugs (Licence Fees) (Amendment) Regulations 2011

Made	5th September 2011
Laid before Parliament	8th September 2011
Coming into force	3rd October 2011

The Secretary of State makes the following Regulations in exercise of the powers conferred upon her by sections 30, 31 and  $37(1)(\mathbf{a})$  of the Misuse of Drugs Act  $1971(\mathbf{b})$ .

In accordance with section 31(3) of that Act the Secretary of State has consulted with the Advisory Council on the Misuse of Drugs.

#### Citation and commencement

**1.** These Regulations may be cited as the Misuse of Drugs (Licence Fees) (Amendment) Regulations 2011 and shall come into force on  $3^{rd}$  October 2011.

#### Amendment of the Misuse of Drugs (Licence Fees) Regulations 2010

**2.** Regulation 1(3) of the Misuse of Drugs (Licence Fees) Regulations 2010(c) is revoked, and for "Citation, commencement, interpretation and extent" in the heading to that regulation there is substituted "Citation, commencement and interpretation".

#### **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

#### (This note is not part of the Regulations)

The Misuse of Drugs (Licence Fees) Regulations 2010 (the "2010 Regulations") were made on  $12^{\text{th}}$  October 2010 and came into force on  $15^{\text{th}}$  November 2010. Regulations 1(3) of the 2010 Regulations - which provided that the 2010 Regulations extended to England, Wales and Scotland, other than the provisions cited in regulation 1(3) which extended to the United Kingdom – was included in the 2010 Regulations in error. That error is corrected in these Regulations which revoke regulation 1(3) of the 2010 Regulations and substitute a new heading to regulation 1 of the 2010 Regulations.
