ROAD TRAFFIC

The M6 Motorway (Junctions 10 to 8) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2012

Made - - - - 12th March 2012

Coming into force - - 19th March 2012

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the M6 Motorway (“the M6”) and connecting roads, is satisfied that traffic on a length of that motorway and two of those connecting roads, in the Metropolitan Borough of Walsall, should be prohibited because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), and of all other powers enabling her in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order: -

1. This Order may be cited as the M6 Motorway (Junctions 10 to 8) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2012 and shall come into force on 19th March 2012.

2. In this Order:

“the motorway” means the southbound carriageway of the M6 from its junction with the exit slip road at Junction 10 to its junction with the link road leading from the northbound carriageway of the M5 at Junction 8;

“a slip road” means –
i) the slip road leading to the southbound carriageway of the M6 at Junction 10; and
ii) the slip road leading to the southbound carriageway of the M6 at Junction 9;

“the works period” means the period starting at 20:00 hours on Saturday 24th March 2012 and ending when the said works have been completed;

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number.

3. Subject as mentioned in article 4, no person shall, during the works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed on the motorway or a slip road.

4. The provisions of article 3 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs and shall not apply to any vehicle –

- (i) being used for police, fire brigade or ambulance purposes;
- (ii) proceeding at the direction of, or with the permission of, a police constable, or traffic officer in uniform; or
- (iii) being used in connection with the said works or by a traffic officer in uniform.
