Citation and commencement

- **1.**—(1) These Regulations may be cited as the Passenger and Goods Vehicles (Recording Equipment) (Tachograph Card Fees) (Amendment) Regulations 2014.
 - (2) These Regulations shall come into force on 31st October 2014.

Amendment of Regulations

- **2.** The Passenger and Goods Vehicles (Recording Equipment) (Tachograph Card Fees) Regulations 2005(**b**) are amended as follows—
 - (a) in the table in Schedule 1 (Driver Card Fees) for "£38" substitute "£32";
 - (b) in the table in Schedule 2 (Company Card Fees) for "£38" substitute "£32".

These Regulations amend card application fees in the Passenger and Goods Vehicles (Recording Equipment) (Tachograph Card Fees) Regulations 2005. Fee changes with the percentage decrease are shown in the table below.

Application for a Driver Card (excluding renewal or replacement)	£38	£32	16%
Application for a Company Card (excluding renewal or replacement)	£38	£32	16%
