The Northern Ireland Assembly (Elections) (Forms) Order 2015

Made - - - - *11th February 2015*

Coming into force in accordance with article 1(2)

In accordance with section 7(1) and (2)(h) of the Political Parties, Elections and Referendums Act 2000^(a), the Secretary of State has consulted with the Electoral Commission prior to this Order being made.

A draft of this Order has been laid before Parliament in accordance with section 96(2)(b) of the Northern Ireland Act 1998^(b) and approved by a resolution of each House of Parliament.

Accordingly, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 34(4) and (6) of the Northern Ireland Act 1998, makes the following Order:

Citation, commencement and interpretation

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Northern Ireland Assembly (Elections) (Forms) Order 2015.

(2) This Order comes into force on the day after the day on which it is made.

(3) In this Order—

“the 2001 Order” means the Northern Ireland Assembly (Elections) Order 2001^(c);

“the 2008 Regulations” means the Representation of the People (Northern Ireland) Regulations 2008^(d); and

“the elections rules” means the parliamentary elections rules contained in Schedule 1 to Representation of the People Act 1983^(e).

Amendments to Schedule 1 to the 2001 Order

2.—(1) Schedule 1 to the 2001 Order (application with modifications of statutory provisions relating to elections)^(f) is amended as follows.

(a) 2000 c. 41; there have been amendments to section 7 but they are not relevant to this Order.

(b) 1998 c. 47; there have been amendments to section 96 but they are not relevant to this Order.

(c) S.I. 2001/2599 was amended by S.I. 2002/1964, S.I. 2003/2989, S.I. 2007/308, S.I. 2009/256, S.I. 2010/2892; S.I. 2014/1116 and S.I. 2014/1804.

(d) S.I. 2008/1741; relevant amendments are referenced in this Order.

(e) 1983 c. 2; relevant amendments are referenced in this Order.

(f) Schedule 1 was substituted in its entirety by S.I. 2009/256. Other relevant amendments are referenced in this Order.

(2) In the right-hand column of the Schedule, in the entry in respect of rule 44B of the elections rules(a), in paragraph (3)(a) omit the words “and authenticated”.

(3) In the right-hand column of the Schedule, alongside the entry in respect of the form of ballot paper in the Appendix of Forms in the elections rules—

(a) omit the words “the front of the”; and

(b) after “ballot paper” insert “(the form of front of ballot paper and the form of back of ballot paper)”.

(4) In the right-hand column of the Schedule, alongside the entry in respect of the form of directions for the guidance of the voters in voting in the Appendix of Forms in the elections rules, for both paragraphs of the existing text, substitute—

“For the form substitute the form set out in the Annex to this Schedule.”.

(5) In the right-hand column of the Schedule, alongside the entry in respect of the form of declaration to be made by the companion of a voter with disabilities in the Appendix of Forms in the elections rules, before the existing text insert—

“For the form substitute the form set out in the Annex to this Schedule.”.

(6) The Annex to Schedule 1 to the 2001 Order is amended as follows.

(7) In the form of front of ballot paper—

(a) in the heading to that form, omit “front of”; and

(b) replace the form with the form in Schedule 1 to this Order.

(8) Replace the form of directions as to printing the ballot paper with the form in Schedule 2 to this Order.

(9) After the form of directions as to printing the ballot paper, insert—

(a) the form of directions for the guidance of the voters in voting in Schedule 3 to this Order; and

(b) the form of declaration to be made by the companion of a voter with disabilities in Schedule 4 to this Order.

Amendments to Schedule 2 to the 2001 Order

3.—(1) Schedule 2 to the 2001 Order (application and modification of provisions of subordinate legislation relating to elections)(b) is amended as follows.

(2) In the right-hand column of the Schedule, alongside the entry in respect of regulation 12 of the 2008 Regulations (device referred to in rule 29(3A)(b) of the parliamentary elections rules), insert—

“In paragraph (7) for the words “mark a cross” substitute “record his vote”.”.

(3) In the right-hand column of the Schedule, alongside the entry in respect of Form A of Schedule 3 to the 2008 Regulations (elector’s official poll card), for both paragraphs of the existing text substitute—

“For the words “UK Parliamentary” substitute “Northern Ireland Assembly”.

For the words “UK or Irish passport” substitute “UK, Irish or EU passport”.”.

(4) In the right-hand column of the Schedule, alongside the entry in respect of Form A1 of Schedule 3 to the 2008 Regulations (elector’s official postal poll card)(c), insert—

“For the words “UK Parliamentary” substitute “Northern Ireland Assembly”.”.

(a) Rules 44A to 44M are inserted by Schedule 1 to the 2001 Order as modifications to the parliamentary elections rules when applied to Assembly elections as the Assembly elections rules.

(b) Schedule 2 was substituted in its entirety by S.I. 2009/256.

(c) The entry in respect of Form A1 was inserted by S.I. 2014/1804.

(5) In the right-hand column of the Schedule, alongside the entry in respect of Form B of Schedule 3 to the 2008 Regulations (proxy’s official poll card), insert—

“For the words “UK Parliamentary” substitute “Northern Ireland Assembly”.

For the words “UK or Irish passport” substitute “UK, Irish or EU passport”.”.

(6) In the right-hand column of the Schedule, alongside the entry in respect of Form B1 of Schedule 3 to the 2008 Regulations (proxy’s official postal poll card)(a), insert—

“For the words “UK Parliamentary” substitute “Northern Ireland Assembly”.”.

(7) After the entry in respect of Form D of Schedule 3 to the 2008 Regulations (declaration as to expenses required by section 75 of the 1983 Act), insert—

“Form E (proxy paper)	For the words “UK Parliamentary” substitute “Northern Ireland Assembly”.”.
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(8) In the right-hand column of the Schedule, alongside the entry in respect of Form F of Schedule 3 to the 2008 Regulations (certificate of employment)(b), before the existing paragraph insert—

“For the words “UK Parliamentary” substitute “Northern Ireland Assembly”.”.

(9) In the right-hand column of the Schedule, alongside the entry in respect of Form L of Schedule 3 to the 2008 Regulations (declaration of identity), for the existing text substitute—

“For the form substitute the form set out in the Annex to this Schedule.”.

(10) In the right-hand column of the Schedule, alongside the entry in respect of Form M of Schedule 3 to the 2008 Regulations (declaration of identity (combined polls)), for the existing text substitute—

“For the form substitute the form set out in the Annex to this Schedule.”.

(11) At the end of the Schedule, insert the Annex in Schedule 5 to this Order.

Article 2(8)

Form of directions as to printing the ballot paper

Directions for printing the ballot paper

1. So far as is practicable, the arrangements set out in paragraphs 2 to 11 must be observed in the printing of the ballot paper.
2. The following words must be printed on the face:
 - (a) the heading "Northern Ireland Assembly Election. [*insert name of constituency*] constituency";
 - (b) the direction "You can make as many or as few choices as you wish. Put the number 1 in the voting box next to your first choice. Put the number 2 in the voting box next to your second choice. Put the number 3 in the voting box next to your third choice. And so on.";
 - (c) the names, addresses and descriptions, if any, of the persons shown in the statement of candidates nominated, in the same order as in that statement; and
 - (d) the words forming part of the emblems mentioned at paragraph 9 below.
3. A box must be printed around:
 - (a) the heading referred to in paragraph 2(a); and
 - (b) the direction referred to in paragraph 2(b);and the direction referred to in paragraph 2(b) must be separated from the heading referred to in paragraph 2(a) by a horizontal rule extending across the box.
4. The following rules must be printed on the face:
 - (a) as part of the box referred to in paragraph 3;
 - (b) the horizontal rule referred to in that paragraph;
 - (c) a horizontal rule above the entry for the first candidate;
 - (d) horizontal rules separating the entries for the candidates from one another;
 - (e) a horizontal rule below the entry for the last candidate; and
 - (f) as part of the boxes on the right-hand side of the ballot paper where the vote is to be marked.
5. The horizontal rules referred to in paragraphs 4(c), (d) and (e) must be equally spaced.
6. The boxes referred to in paragraph 4(f) must not touch any horizontal rule and each one must be equidistant between the horizontal rule above it and the horizontal rule below it.
7. Each of the horizontal rules referred to in paragraph 4(c) and (d) must extend from a point level with the text on the left-hand side of the page to a point directly above the right-hand edge of the box below that rule.

8. The horizontal rule referred to in paragraph 4(e) must:
 - (a) extend from a point level with the text on the left-hand side of the page to a point directly below the right-hand edge of the box above that rule; and
 - (b) be thicker than the other horizontal rules.
9. Where a registered emblem is to be printed against a candidate's name –
 - (a) it must be printed adjacent and to the right of the candidate's particulars; and
 - (b) its size as printed must not exceed 2 centimetres square.
10. All the words on the front of the ballot paper must appear in the same large type except that –
 - (a) the heading referred to in paragraph 2(a) must appear in very large and bold type;
 - (b) the direction referred to in paragraph 2(b) must appear in very large type and the words "You can make as many or as few choices as you wish.", "1", "2", "3" and "And so on." must appear in bold type;
 - (c) the surname of each candidate must appear in large capitals and bold type;
 - (d) the forename and other names of each candidate must appear in bold type;
 - (e) the names of registered political parties and the word "Independent" must appear in bold type.
11. The number and other unique identifying mark must be printed close to each other on the back of the ballot paper.

- 2 Take your ballot paper to a voting booth.



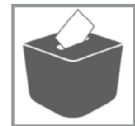
- 3 Read the instructions in the booth and mark your ballot paper.

1. For your vote to be counted, you must fill in, in the presence of a witness, and return this declaration of identity with your ballot paper. You must do this even if you have already signed a similar declaration of identity for another election to be held on the same day.
2. Make sure you have filled in all the information on this declaration of identity and your witness has signed it.
3. On the ballot paper, number the candidates in order of preference
Putting "1" against your first choice,
"2" against your second choice and so on.
4. You should not put the same number against more than one candidate.
5. You may number as many or as few candidates as you wish.
6. Different colours are used for the ballot papers for each election. Each ballot paper has its own ballot paper envelope (the smaller envelope marked "A"), declaration of identity and covering envelope (the larger envelope marked "B"). The covering envelope and declaration of identity will refer to the colour of the ballot paper. It is important to use the correct envelopes and declaration of identity.
7. Place each ballot paper in the correct smaller envelope marked "A" and seal it. Then put the envelope marked "A", together with the correct declaration of identity, in the correct larger envelope marked "B" and seal it.
8. We must receive your postal vote in the envelope provided by **10pm on [day] [date of poll]**.
9. After receiving this postal vote, you cannot vote in person at a polling station in this election.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order)

Schedules 1 and 2 to the Northern Ireland Assembly (Elections) Order 2001 apply certain provisions of the Representation of the People Act 1983 (c. 2) and the Representation of the People (Northern Ireland) Regulations 2008 (S.I. 2008/1741) to elections to the Northern Ireland Assembly. The forms for use at parliamentary elections are amended by the Parliamentary Elections (Forms) (Northern Ireland) Order 2015. Articles 2 and 3 of this Order amend Schedules 1 and 2 to apply those amended provisions to Assembly elections, with appropriate changes.

The forms which have been changed for Assembly elections (whether by modification or substitution of parliamentary forms) are the forms relating to ballot papers, directions as to printing the ballot paper, declarations to be made by the companion of a voter with disabilities, poll cards, postal poll cards, proxy poll cards, proxy postal poll cards, guidance for voters, proxy papers, certificates of employment, declarations of identity, and declarations of identity at combined polls.

An impact assessment has not been produced for this instrument as no impact on the private or voluntary sectors is foreseen.

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
