# The Mali (Sanctions) (EU Exit) Regulations 2020

### **PART 7**

#### Enforcement

### **Penalties for offences**

- **32.**—(1) A person who commits an offence under any provision of Part 3 (Finance) or regulation 23 (finance: licensing offences), is liable—
  - (a) on summary conviction in England and Wales, to imprisonment for a term not exceeding [F1 the general limit in a magistrates' court] or a fine (or both);
  - (b) on summary conviction in Scotland, to imprisonment for a term not exceeding 12 months or a fine not exceeding the statutory maximum (or both);
  - (c) on summary conviction in Northern Ireland, to imprisonment for a term not exceeding 6 months or a fine not exceeding the statutory maximum (or both);
  - (d) on conviction on indictment, to imprisonment for a term not exceeding 7 years or a fine (or both).
  - (2) A person who commits an offence under regulation 9(6) (confidentiality) is liable—
    - (a) on summary conviction in England and Wales, to imprisonment for a term not exceeding [F2 the general limit in a magistrates' court] or a fine (or both);
    - (b) on summary conviction in Scotland, to imprisonment for a term not exceeding 12 months or a fine not exceeding the statutory maximum (or both);
    - (c) on summary conviction in Northern Ireland, to imprisonment for a term not exceeding 6 months or a fine not exceeding the statutory maximum (or both);
    - (d) on conviction on indictment, to imprisonment for a term not exceeding 2 years or a fine (or both).
- (3) A person who commits an offence under regulation 25(6) or 29 (information offences in connection with Part 3) is liable—
  - (a) on summary conviction in England and Wales, to imprisonment for a term not exceeding 6 months or a fine (or both);
  - (b) on summary conviction in Scotland, to imprisonment for a term not exceeding 6 months or a fine not exceeding level 5 on the standard scale (or both);
  - (c) on summary conviction in Northern Ireland, to imprisonment for a term not exceeding 6 months or a fine not exceeding level 5 on the standard scale (or both).
- (4) In relation to an offence committed before [F32nd May 2022], the reference in each of paragraphs (1)(a) and (2)(a) to [F4the general limit in a magistrates' court] is to be read as a reference to 6 months.
