The Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying) (Teignmouth) Regulations 2021

Made	-	-	16th April 2021
Coming into force	-	-	3rd July 2021

The Secretary of State has decided that it is in the public interest to restrict flying in the vicinity of Teignmouth, Devon, by reason of the holding of flying displays associated with the Teignmouth Airshow 2021.

The Secretary of State makes the following Regulations in exercise of the powers conferred by article 239 of the Air Navigation Order $2016(\mathbf{a})$.

Citation and commencement

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying) (Teignmouth) Regulations 2021 and come into force on 3rd July 2021.

Interpretation

2. In regulation 3(1) the times referred to are Co-ordinated Universal Time(**b**).

Restricted airspace

3.—(1) Subject to paragraph (2), between 1100 hours and 1700 hours on 3rd July 2021 no aircraft is to fly below 5,500 feet above mean sea level within the area bounded by a circle having a radius of 3.5 nautical miles whose centre is at 503235N 0032921W.

(2) Paragraph (1) does not apply to any aircraft flying in accordance with a permission issued by the Teignmouth Airshow Flying Display Director.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations)

These Regulations impose restrictions on flying in airspace in the vicinity of Teignmouth, Devon, during air displays that are scheduled to take place there on 3rd July 2021. Many aircraft will be involved in high energy manoeuvres during the displays and therefore the Civil Aviation Authority and Department for Transport agree that flying should be restricted in the vicinity of the event for reasons of public safety.

The times mentioned in regulation 3(1) are Co-ordinated Universal Time (UTC) which is one hour behind British Summer Time (BST).

In relation to the permission mentioned in regulation 3(2), the Teignmouth Airshow Flying Display Director may be contacted as notified.

Full details of this Statutory Instrument will be promulgated by Aeronautical Information Circular (AIC) and Notice to Airmen (NOTAM).
